The Boise River Greenbelt follows its namesake river among towering trees, connecting downtown Boise with neighborhoods



Barber Park downstream. In Eagle, a new bike-ped bridge was constructed across the Boise River, connecting two sides of the trail.

The Boise River Greenbelt follows its namesake river among towering trees, connecting downtown Boise with neighborhoods and the business district. Leading out of the city both north-west and south-east, the trail connects suburbs with parks and the Lucky Peak State Recreation Area.

About the Route

The 46.1-mile trail is one of the area's most popular for its scenic views, wildlife, and access to popular parks and recreation sites. In addition, it provides a non-motorized corridor for commuters and passes by the university campus.

Most of the trail is paved except for a 1.5-mile section from
