The 19.5-mile Madison County Transit (MCT) Goshen Trail is a namesake after the old Goshen Road that was built in 1808 to supply



The MCT Goshen Trail forms the north-south backbone of the Madison County trail system, and it meets or intersects five other trails in the network: the [MCT Schoolhouse Trail](#), [MCT Ronald J. Foster Heritage Trail](#), [MCT Nickel Plate Trail](#), [MCT Nature Trail](#), and [MCT Watershed Trail](#).

The 19.5-mile Madison County Transit (MCT) Goshen Trail is a namesake after the old Goshen Road that was built in 1808 to supply salt to the first permanent settlers of Madison County and crosses the road several times throughout Madison County.

Traveling through the former Illinois Belt Line rail corridor, the rail-trail offers a good mix of sights to enjoy along the way. Farmland and cityscapes, bridges and tunnels, parks and neighborhoods, tree cover and open spaces
