While a longer portion of the same corridor farther south is now home to the paved [Cape Cod Rail Trail](#), the Old Colony Nature Pathway is much more rustic, with a sand and dirt surface that is best suited to mountain bikes, hiking boots and horses.

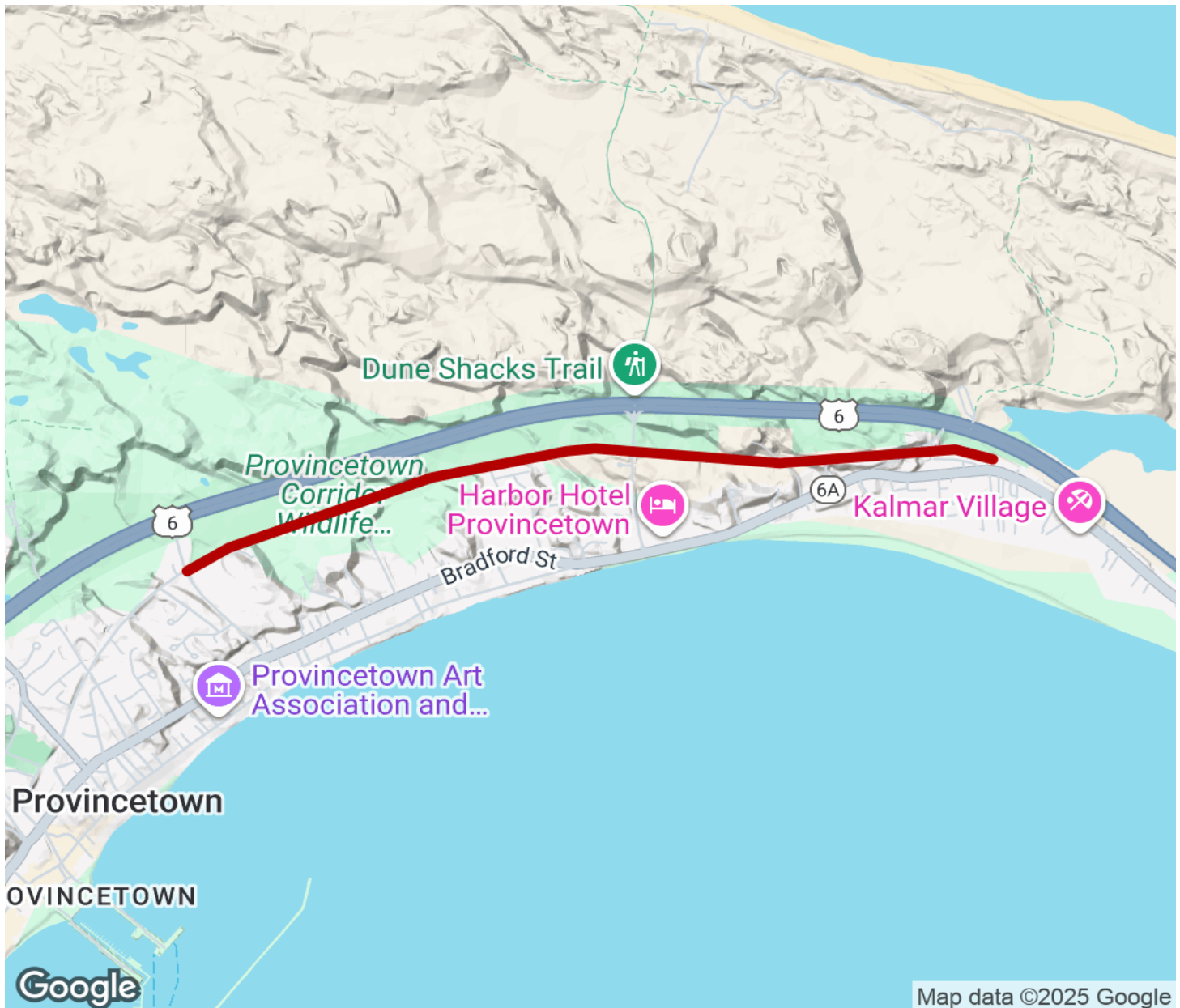
