Old Colony Nature Pathway

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The Old Colony Nature Pathway is a short trail open on a former Old Colony Railroad corridor in Provincetown, a picturesque vacation destination at the tip of Cape Cod. While a longer portion of the same corridor farther south is now home to the paved [Cape Cod Rail Trail](#), the Old Colony Nature Pathway is much more rustic, with a sand and dirt surface that is best suited to mountain bikes, hiking boots and horses.

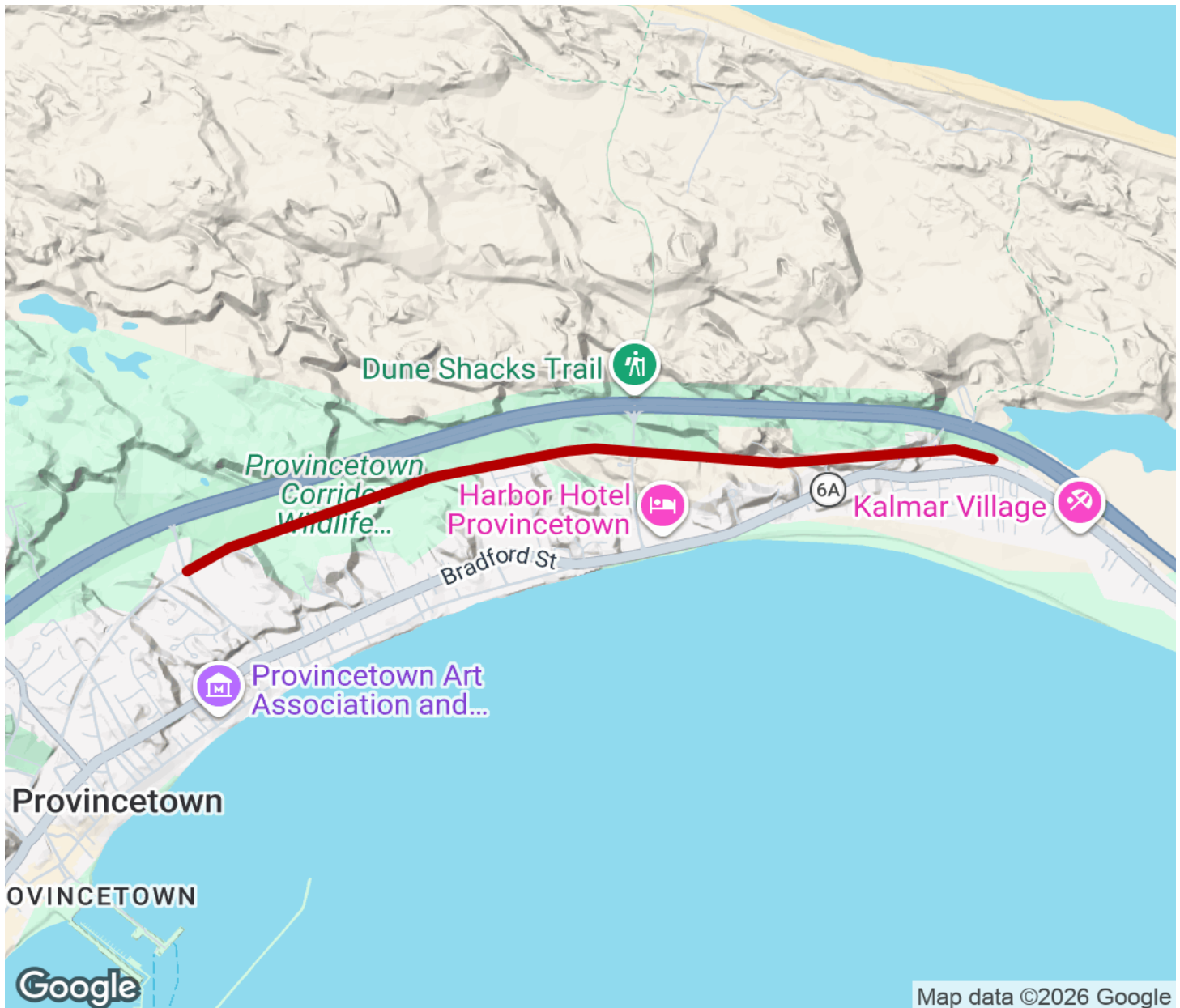
