For most of its length, the trail parallels State Route 69, but your awareness of the lightly-traveled road is masked by the vegetation that has grown since the corridor was abandoned in 1970. And, most likely, you will be surprised by the amazing number of white-tailed deer using the trail as a travel route.

To get to the trail, take Andy's Lane from behind the Community Center, turn right on Van Lear Drive, left on Old Dump Road, and after two blocks turn left and then make a right on to the trail.
