Parking is available at the western end of the trail in Felch.



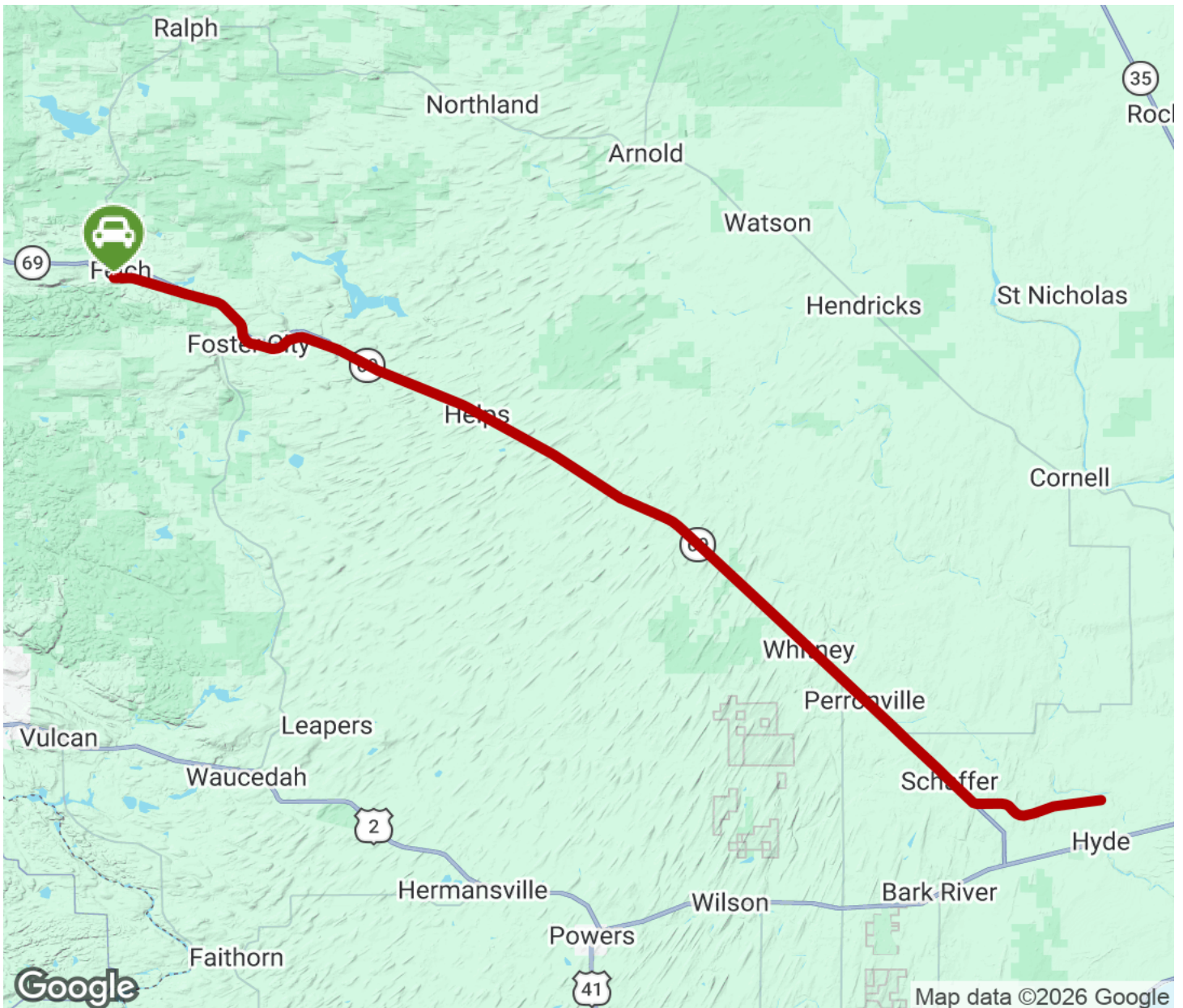
