About the Route

The two anchor towns of Mankato on the western end and Faribault on the eastern end are the trail's largest towns and are home to many restaurants and shops. In Waterville, near the trail's midpoint, the trail leaves the former railroad corridor for a short signed detour on city streets. Other towns on the route are smaller but can serve as refreshing rest stops.

At times, the trail runs immediately adjacent to several large lakes, including Wells Lake, Cannon Lake, Sakatah Lake, Lake Elysian, and Eagle Lake. Be sure to stop for an extended rest at Sakatah Lake State Park; the trail runs through the park for 3 miles and the area is a great place to picnic, hike, or swim.

#### Connections

In Mankato, trail users can continue along the <u>North Minnesota River Trail</u>.

In Faribault, trail users can continue along the <u>Northern Link</u> <u>Trail</u> and the <u>Batchelder Trail</u>.
