The Rock Island Trail in Lincoln, Nebraska, runs for nearly 7 miles through the city on a north-south corridor, between the University



The Rock Island Trail in Lincoln, Nebraska, runs for nearly 7 miles through the city on a north-south corridor, between the University of Nebraska's flagship campus and Densmore Park. The trail is an important and popular travel route for nonmotorized uses, linking several city parks, neighborhoods, and schools. The Salt Creek Bridge in Wilderness Park connects the trail to the Jaimaca North Trail just across the river at the southern end of the trail.

The Rock Island Trail links to the <u>Southpointe Trail</u> at Densmore Park; to the <u>Tierra-Williamsburg Trail</u> at 27th Street just south of SR 2; to the <u>Helen Boosalis Trail</u> (a.k.a. the Highway 2 Trail) just north of SR 2; and to the <u>Billy Wolff Trail</u> at the north end of the zoo.
