The Karamac Trail is a short trail that follows the New Jersey side of the Delaware River. The trail follows an old railroad right-of-



The Karamac Trail is a short trail that follows the New Jersey side of the Delaware River. The trail follows an old railroad right-of-way; there is a railroad mile marker just a few yards from the southern end of the trail. Trail Users can also follow the banks of the Delaware River to old bridge abutments where the railroad used to cross the river.

At the southern end of the trail, there is a gate near the traffic signal that controls the one land section of Old Mine Road. At the north end of the trail, trail users can park at the large Fairview parking area and follow a hiking trail down to the river where the rail trail begins.


The Karamac Trail runs through the Delaware Water Gap, with parking available at both ends.
