Overview

The Santa Fe Rail Trail follows the old Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway line, running almost 17 miles between Santa Fe's Railyard Park on the southwestern end of the city and Highway 285 in Lamy.

About the Route

The pathway parallels the Santa Fe Southern Railway, an active tourism line, in a configuration known as rail-with-trail.

Beyond the capital city, the trail makes its way through El Dorado and runs through hilly, red-dirt terrain among a beautiful landscape of yucca, junipers, and piñon trees. A



traditional rail-trail on its northern end, it's paved for nearly 4 miles between the Railyard and Rabbit Road. Beyond that, the surface is hard-packed crushed stone and gravel and significant elevation change, best suited for gravel, hybrid, or mountain bikes. Be especially cautious after a rainfall, as the trail conditions can become muddy.

The connection to Lamy is still in the planning phase and currently requires riding on paved rural roads for about 2.5 miles. In Lamy, history buffs may want to check out the century-old depot in town. The station (at 152 Old Lamy Trail) serves Amtrak's Southwest Chief route between Chicago and Los Angeles. Learn more about the region's past at the nearby Lamy Railroad and History Museum.

Connections

Just south of the Santa Fe Railyard Park, the Santa Fe Rail Trail connects to the <u>Acequia Trail</u>. At Siringo Road near the southern end of the trail, it connects to the <u>Arroyo De Los</u> <u>Chamisos Trail</u>.
