John Kieran Nature Trail

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The John Kieran Nature Trail is a short loop that borders Van Cortlandt Lake and nearby wetlands. The trail is a wonderful site for bird-watching. Significant sites along the way include an old cemetery and the 67-acre Parade Ground, a large field that was once the site of a large Indigenous settlement. A portion of the trail follows the former Putnam Line of the New York Central Railroad that once connected New York City to Brewster and points north.

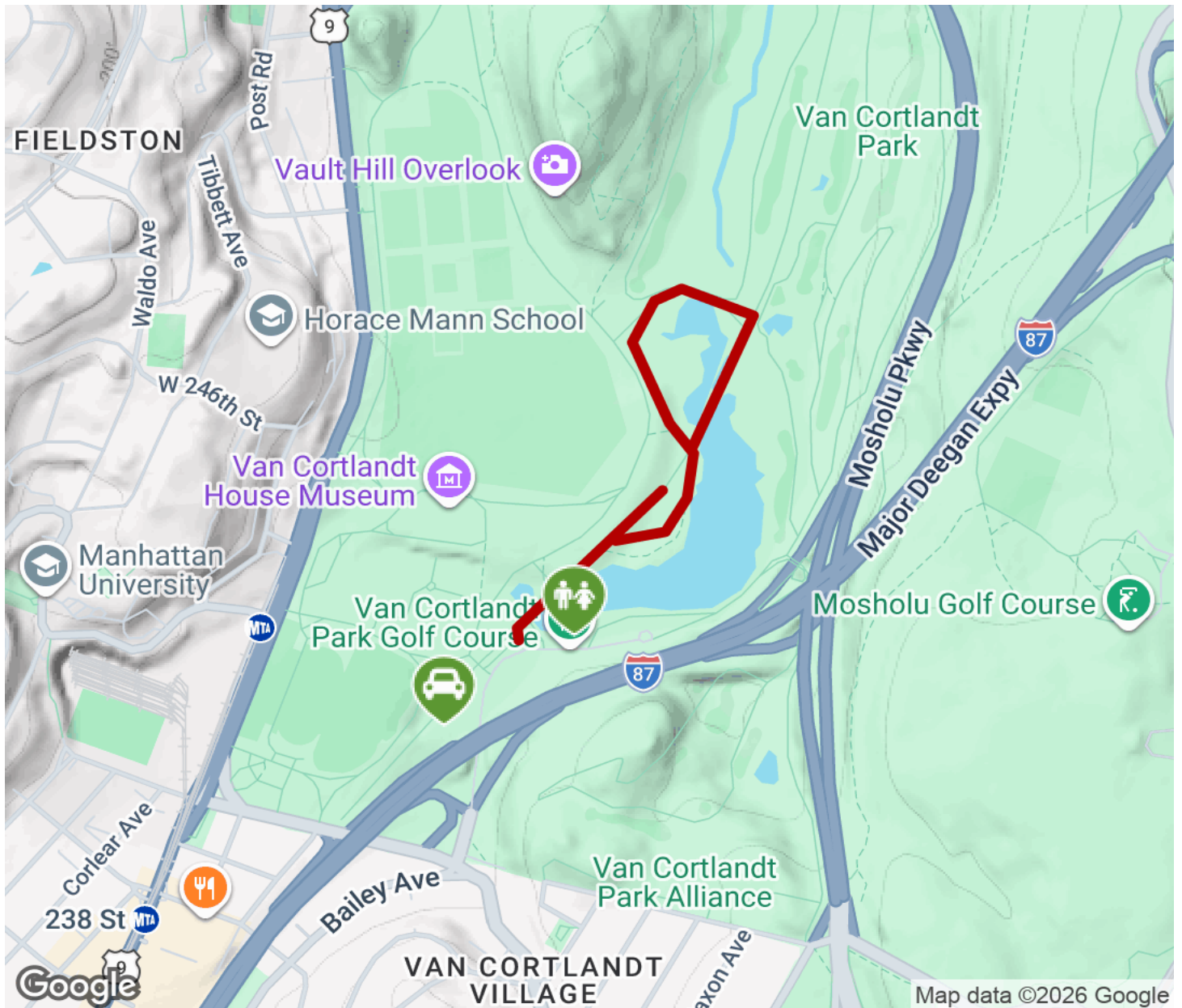
