

The Sissy Danforth Rivergate Trail stretches from Acheson's Crossing at State Route 11 in Philadelphia, New York, west to Clayton. A second spur runs north from Theresa to Redwood. The trail occupies the former Penn Central Railroad and is also popular with ATVs and snowmobiles.

The western spur of the trail is owned and managed by the Thousand Islands Land Trust while the two eastern spurs between Philadelphia and Redwood are managed by a local ATV trust, are open to motorized use and is composed of rougher trail conditions.
