The Solon to Chagrin Falls Trail is a developing multiuse rail-trail that will connect the city of Solon and the village of Chagrin Falls.



This open section of trail is maintained and managed by Cleveland Metroparks.

The Solon section of the trail is under construction. Following a former Wheeling and Lake Erie Railroad Company corridor, the trail will run between Som Center Road and the city boundary near the Deer Run cul-de-sac. The entire off-route will be paved, 10ft wide, and ADA accessible.

Cleveland Metroparks will complete 1500ft section of trail between the Solon city boundary and Chagrin River Road to create a continuous route.

The Solon to Chagrin Falls Trail is a developing multiuse rail-trail that will connect the city of Solon and the village of Chagrin Falls. Currently the trail runs 1.6 miles between Pine Street and Chagrin River Road in Chagrin Falls.

About the Route

From its northeast end on Pine Street, the trail heads southwest through a wooded corridor. There are several road crossings, providing easy access to the surrounding residential neighborhoods and local businesses.

The trail is paved between Pine Street and Rocker Avenue. Continuing southwest towards Bentleyville and Solon, the trail surface is gravel and grass. The southwest end of the trail is on Chagrin River Road.


The Solon to Chagrin Falls Trail runs between Pine St (Chagrin Falls) and Chagrin River Rd (Chagrin Falls).
