




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Little Beaver Creek Greenway Trail Ohio Little Beaver Creek Greenway Trail

## The Little Beaver Creek Greenway Trail runs for 12.6 miles through the rolling hills of eastern Ohio. About the Route Mile marker 0 for



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### About the Route

Mile marker 0 for the Little Beaver Creek Greenway Trail can be found at its southern end in Lisbon. Located in a former railroad depot, the Lisbon trailhead is about a quarter mile from the actual start of the greenway. The trailhead has a large, paved parking lot and restrooms. From there, the trail gradually rises about 450 feet over its 12.6-mile length, running north to Washingtonville.

The paved pathway parallels the Middle Fork of the Little Beaver Creek and has many beautiful and interesting features, including glacial outwashes, upland fields, mature ravine woodlots, and wetland wildlife habitats. A highlight is the Teegarden-Centennial Covered Bridge, on the National Register of Historic Places, located in the community of Teegarden, about halfway along the trail.

Remnants of the area's industrial heritage can still be found along the trail. In Leetonia, near the northern terminus of the greenway, the Beehive Coke Ovens Park sits on the remnants of 200 coal-fired ovens built in 1866. Burning coal without oxygen creates coke, which burns hot enough to melt iron. More than 70,000 tons of coke were produced annually during the site's heyday, shipped by rail car to Pittsburgh and other iron-producing cities. The ovens were permanently closed in 1930, but like the rail line, would find new life decades later. In the 1990s, the site was turned into a park and nature preserve, and the coke ovens were added to the National Register of Historic Places.

The greenway is built on the right of way of the Pittsburgh, Lisbon & Western (PL&W) Railroad line. For most of the first half of the 20th century, the PL&W ran both freight and passengers throughout Pennsylvania and Ohio. When the PL&W ran into increasing financial difficulties in the late 1950s and early 1960s, it merged with the Erie Lackawanna Railroad. The outlook improved for a short time but took another downturn in the following decades. After the railroad abandoned the track, much of it fell into the hands of local philanthropist Allen Dickey, who would later donate it to Columbiana County. The first 10 miles of trail were built in 2000. Twenty years later, the trail may be as important to the local community as the former railroad.

### Connections

As a segment of the Great Ohio Lake to River Greenway, the Little Beaver Creek Greenway is a part of the trail system that begins in Ashtabula County and continues through Trumbull, Mahoning, and Columbiana counties.

# Parking & Trail Access

The Little Beaver Creek Greenway Trail runs between S Lincoln Ave. (Lisbon) and 415 S County Rd (Washingtonville), with parking available at both ends.

Parking is also available at several locations along the trail, including:

- Leetonia Beehive Coke Ovens Park (999 Cherry Valley Rd, Leetonia)
- Lisbon Trailhead (232 S Market St, Lisbon), located in a former railroad depot about a quarter mile east from the southern end of the greenway.
