Stillwater Scenic Walkway Rhode Island



The Stillwater Scenic Walkway is a short trail that follows an old railroad bed between Capron Road and State Route 104 (Farnum



The Stillwater Scenic Walkway is a short trail that follows an old railroad bed between Capron Road and State Route 104 (Farnum Pike) south of Smithfield. The trail passes through a wooded area along the shore of Stillwater Pond and Capron Pond. The trail provides access to Stillwater Reservoir.

Look for wildlife, particularly birds, along the way. You will also see low dams along the Woonasquatucket River and the remains of the old Stillwater village.
