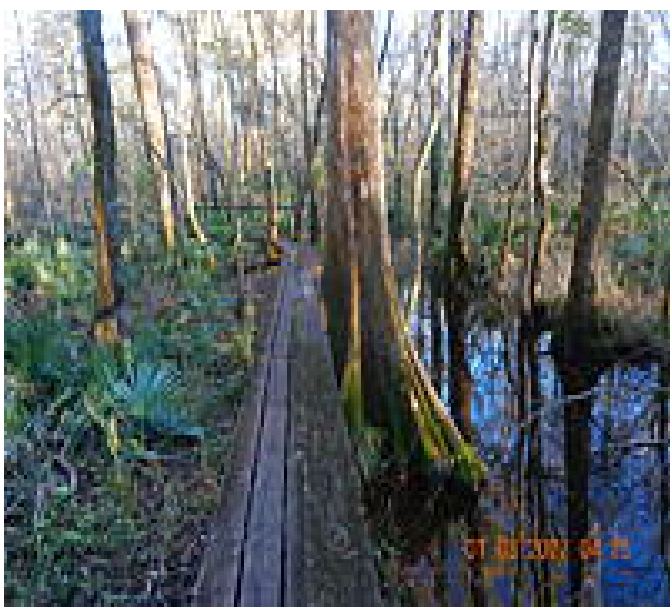

The Edisto Nature Trail loops through a forest maintained by WestRock (formerly Westvaco Corporation), a paper and



King's Highway, an old railroad tram and an old phosphate operation. Edisto Beach State Park and Colleton State Park are located nearby, for those looking for a wider variety of recreation options.

The Edisto Nature Trail loops through a forest maintained by WestRock (formerly Westvaco Corporation), a paper and packaging manufacturer.

About the Route

The main loop is 1 mile, and an inner loop adds 0.5 mile. Both sections of the trail wind through a typical low-country forest, which includes mature pines, hardwoods and bald cypress.

Grab a brochure at the trailhead for a self-guided tour and learn about the nearly 60 varieties of flora and fauna. A section of the trail winds through a cypress swamp atop an old railroad bed, which provides an excellent view of the forest. Other interesting landmarks include the historic

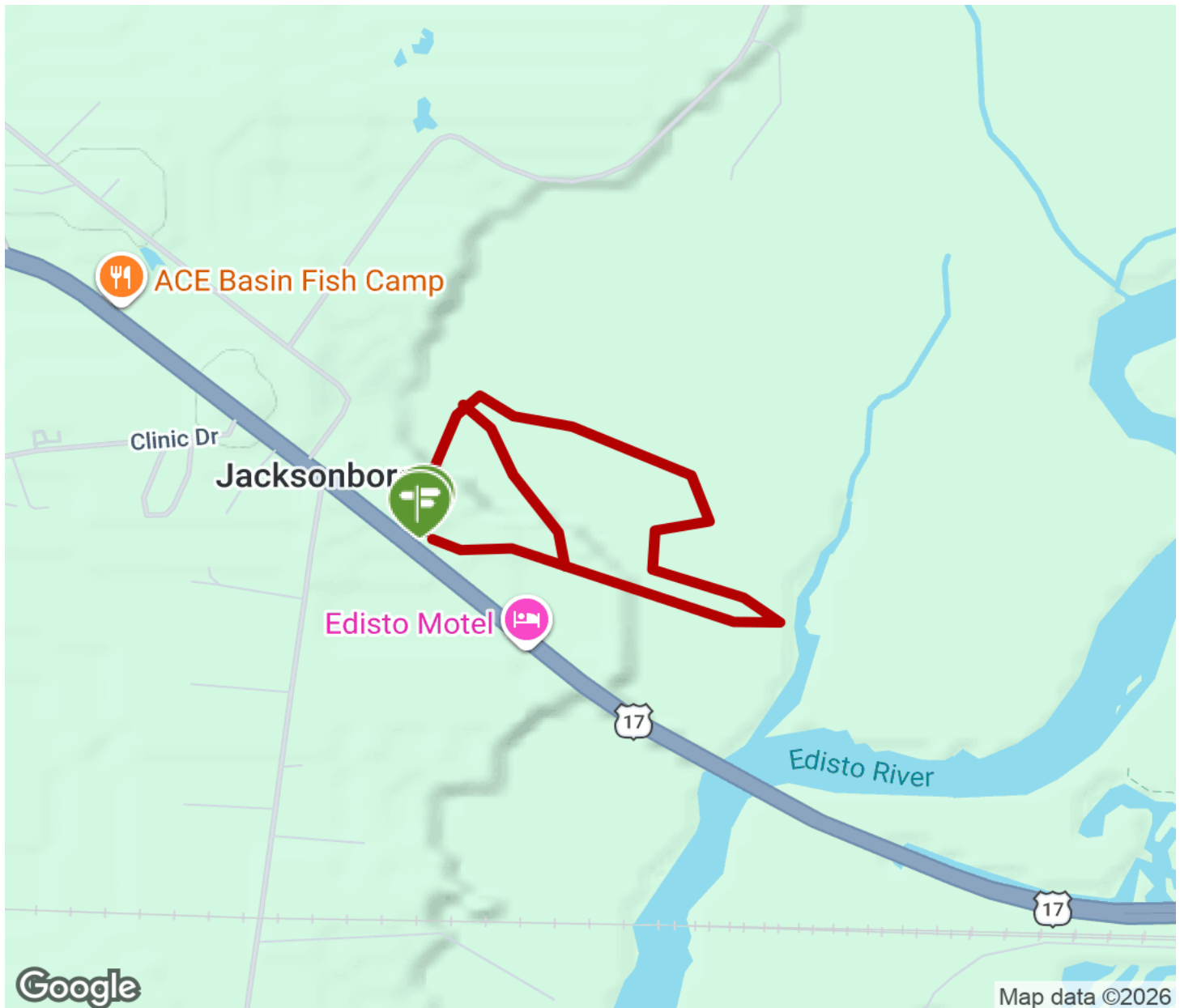
The Edisto Nature Trail runs in a loop beginning at 17038 Ace Basin Pkwy, where parking is available.
