

While the eastern end of the trail travels through a suburban landscape, the westernmost end of the trail cuts through marshland along a tree-lined corridor that takes trail users out to Higgins Pier. This end of the trail is a dead end, and the

nearest access point at the western end is along Main St.

Connections

At the southern end of the West Ashley Bikeway, trail users can connect to the nearby, West Ashley Greenway

Running arrow-straight between the Ashley River West and a wholesale produce stand on Wappoo Road, the West Ashley Bikeway links several suburban Charleston neighborhoods, providing a 2.7-mile cycling and walking path.

About the Route

Initial plans called for this corridor were entirely different. After the Seaboard Coastline Railroad abandoned the line in 1976, the state wanted to build an expressway along the route. When that plan fell through, the city of Charleston negotiated to lease the corridor from the state for \$1 a year and completed the trail in 1983.

The trail had developed a reputation for poor
