Oxford Bikeway

New Jersey

The Oxford Bikeway is a .9 mile long pave trail constructed on an abandoned railroad right-of-way. The trail can be accessed at



railroad bed. Lower Denmark Road ends opposite the fire station at Wall Street. There are no cross streets along the entire length of the trail.

The Oxford Bikeway is a .9 mile long pave trail constructed on an abandoned railroad right-of-way. The trail can be accessed at three points. To the north the trail ends at Pequest Road, however there is no place to park a car at this location. A dedicated driveway to the trail and parking is adjacent to the lane into the town's sewer plant. There is a sign indicating bikeway parking, the drive looks very much like a section of trail, it is only a single lane wide. This location puts you in about the middle of the trail. The access point closest to Oxford is at the end of Lower Denmark Road. There is a slight climb here that takes you from the road level where you can park to the railroad grade level. If parking at the sewer plant location about another half mile can be added to your journey by taking Lower Denmark Road into town. It appears that a portion of Lower Denmark Road was constructed on the

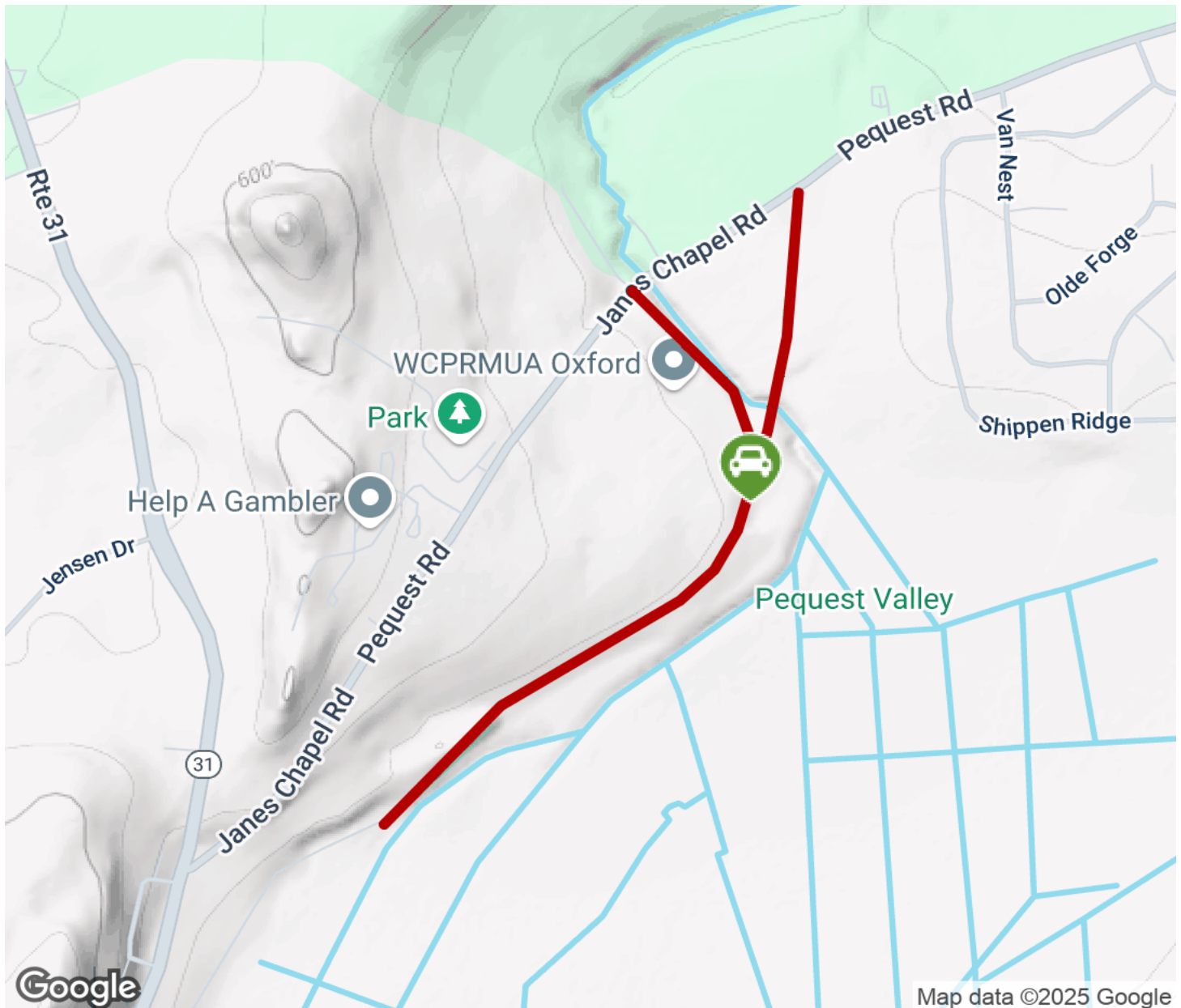
