




St. Paul Trail Arkansas



Fayetteville's St. Paul Trail occupies a short section of what was once an 8-mile long branch line of the St. Louis-San Francisco



Fayetteville's St. Paul Trail occupies a short section of what was once an 8-mile long branch line of the St. Louis-San Francisco Railway (the Frisco) between Fayetteville and St. Paul, Arkansas. The paved rail-trail runs through woodlands and past industrial properties. The eastern trailhead is located just a couple blocks south of the White River Baseball Complex.
