Wichita River and Holliday Creek Trails

Texas



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The Wichita River Trail follows the Big Wichita River, a tributary of the Red River. The trail begins in beautifully wooded Lucy Park, making a loop. The park has shelters, playgrounds, a log cabin and a landscaped duck pond.

The trail also passes River Bend Nature Works, a 54-foot-high ornamental waterfall, the Multi Purpose Events Center, Berends Landing facility (with a 100-foot-high interior climbing wall), O'Reilly Park and a fishing pond in Williams Park. From Scott Avenue/US 287 to Lake Wichita Park (another 8+ miles) the trail is called Holliday Creek.

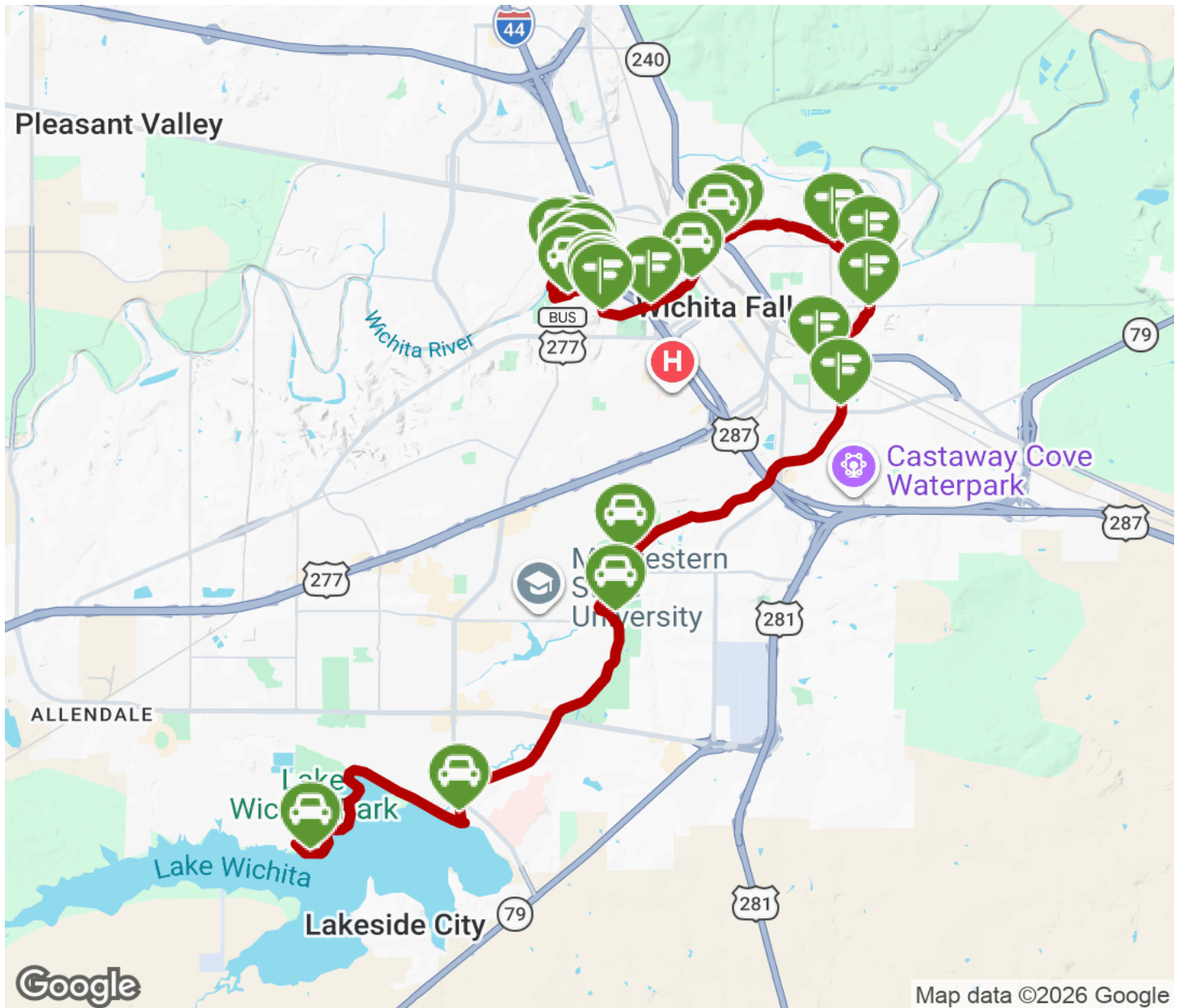
Parking & Trail Access
