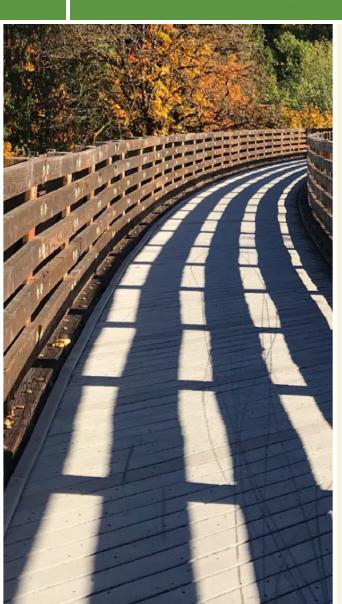

### **Bronx River** Greenway New York

#### Overview

The Bronx River Greenway runs for 22 miles along the Bronx River, traveling from the mouth of the East River north to the Kensico Dam, providing views of the natural history of the area. Because the trail is under development, there are several gaps between its completed sections. Therefore, carrying a trail map with you (or on your smartphone) is recommended.

#### About the Route

Beginning at the trail's southern end, the trail heads along a restored salt marsh at the mouth of the Bronx River. You can access the trail at the eastern entrance to Soundview Park at Leland and O'Brien Avenues. The path travels uninterrupted for 1.5 miles through the park, which is well-used by families from around the area. This trail segment ends at Lafayette Avenue.

There's a 0.5-mile gap to reach the next section of the trail, which traverses Concrete Plant Park. Walkers can use the sidewalks along city streets to bridge this gap, but thrucyclists will need to be comfortable with on-street biking until the trail is completed here. Concrete Plant Park, finished in 2009, shows a unique and thought-provoking mix of industrial uses and public space that shouldn't be missed.

After traveling 0.4 miles through Concrete Plant Park, the trail continues as an on-street connection along the access road of Sheridan Expressway 0.4 miles to the southern end of Starlight Park, where trail users can find one of the many attractive river access points for boats. In the park, plan a stop at the Bronx River House, the new headquarters of the Bronx River Alliance, for maps, restrooms, and a water fountain.

Continue north from Starlight Park, where the trail jogs east as the Bronx River enters the Bronx Zoo and the New York Botanical Garden. If time permits, spend an afternoon off the trail wandering through the zoo or the famous botanical garden and its living museum. You can also enjoy the multitude of free public parks that dot the trail throughout this 2-mile section. Not to be missed is the Bronx River Forest, just north of the botanical garden, which is being restored by the New York City Department of Parks and Recreation and the Bronx River Alliance and provides an oasis of green in one of the nation's most urban areas.

The trail continues north to the Kensico Dam, listed on the National Register of Historic Places. There are several onstreet connections along the remaining journey to the Kensico Dam, ranging in length from 0.5 to 2 miles. Side streets can complete these connections until the trail is constructed, but there are no signs to guide you through them to the next section of the trail, so bringing a map will be
