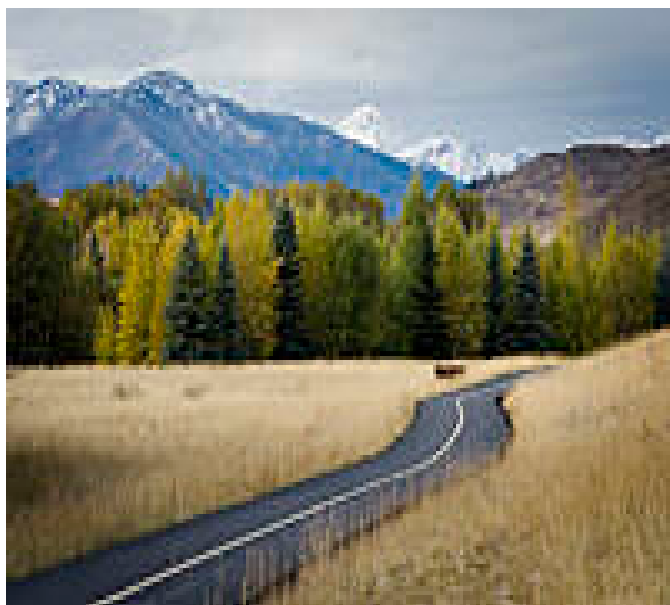

In summer, biking, inline skating, walking, and jogging are popular trail activities. In winter, cross-country skiers and snowshoers come out en masse.

About the Route

With a central spine spanning 20+ miles and a loop with additional spurs at its northern end that make a total of 36 miles of trail, the Wood River Trail serves as an important connector for the communities in the Wood River Valley

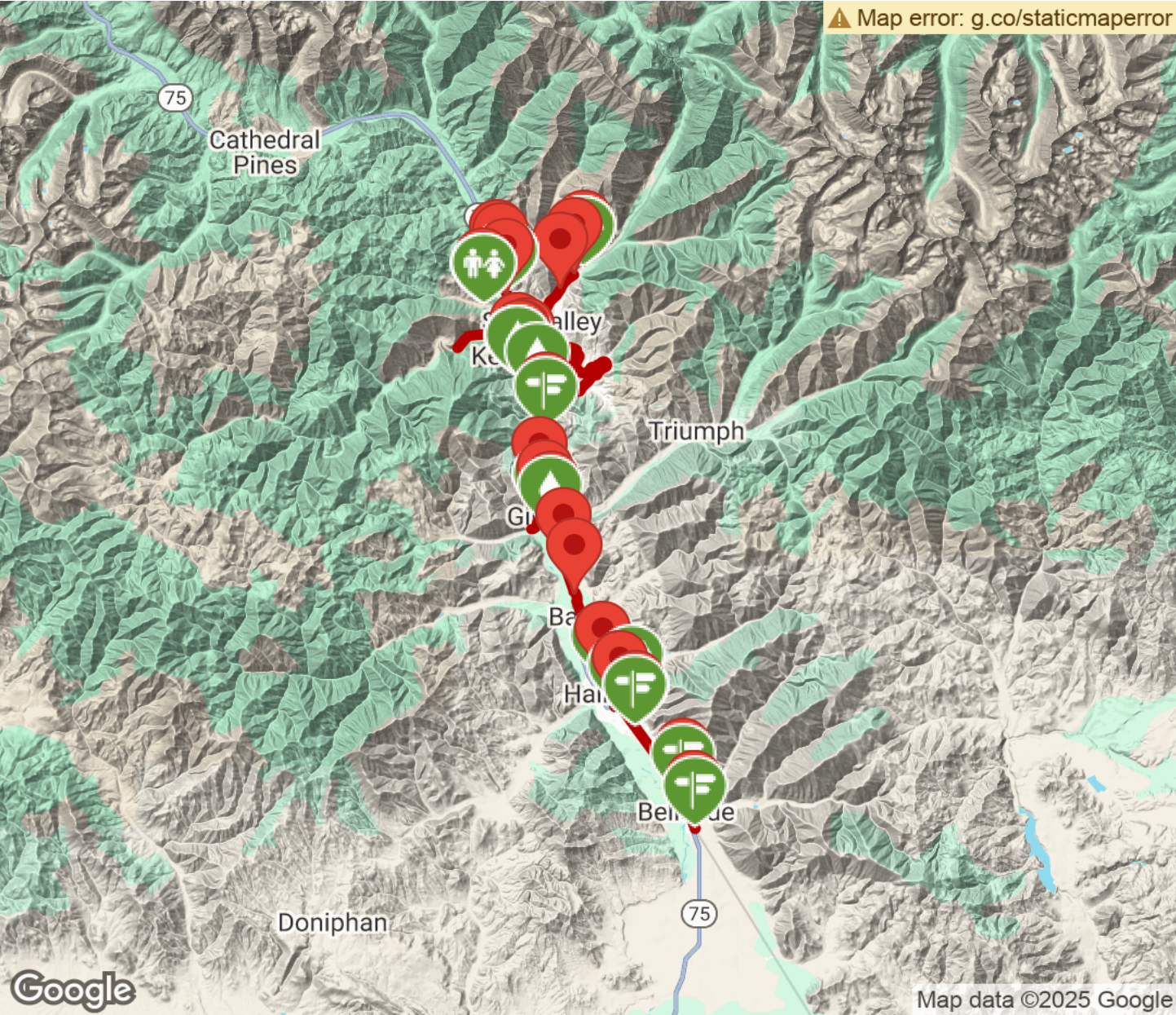
