The Jackson Hole Community Pathway System offers 27 miles of trail through some of Wyoming's most beautiful country and



The Jackson Hole Community Pathway System offers 27 miles of trail through some of Wyoming's most beautiful country and connects the towns of Jackson, Teton Village (a popular ski town), and Wilson. Winding through the Jackson Hole Valley, the trail is nestled among the Rocky Mountains.

On the north end of Jackson, you can pick up the <u>North</u> <u>Pathway</u> to head north to Moose, headquarters of Grand Teton National Park, which sprawls more than 300,000 acres and offers camping and a wealth of outdoor recreational opportunities. East of the trail is the National Elk Refuge, home not only to elk, but also bison, bighorn sheep, moose, deer, and other wildlife.

This network of trails includes the Russ Garaman Trail,



School Trail, Indian Springs Trail, Melody Ranch Trail, Teton Pines/Teton Village Road Pathway, and the Wilson Centennial Trail.


Parking & Trail Access
