

### Yelm-Rainier-Tenino Trail

Washington



## The Yelm-Rainier-Tenino Trails runs for 14 miles between the rural towns of Tenino and Yelm. The paved trail travels through



The Yelm-Rainier-Tenino Trails runs for 14 miles between the rural towns of Tenino and Yelm. The paved trail travels through agricultural areas, forests, and wetlands, and it takes a gentle climb of 320 from Tenino to Yelm.

#### About the Route

The western endpoint of the Yelm-Rainier-Tenino Trails leaves from Crowder Rd & Park Ave in Tenino, but there's a trailhead at S Olympia St & Park Ave for the trail. After running past a few homes, a ballpark, and restrooms, the route parallels State Route 507. The forested path then crosses Military Road to rise above SR 507. The road is never far, but a swath of fir and maple trees provides a barrier. A historical kiosk precedes 1 mile of scenic forest trail beside McIntosh Lake, where herons come to watch

#### trail users.

At 8.5 miles, the trail reaches its Rainier trailhead at Rochester St W & Centre St NW. The landscape widens as you pass through Wilkowski Park and cross under a trestle. The trail runs closer to the road for the next 5 miles as it approaches Yelm, eventually reaching its eastern endpoint at Railroad Street SW in Yelm.

#### Connections

Just before the trail's midpoint, the Yelm-Rainier-Tenino Trail intersects with the Chehalis Western Trail.

#### Trail History

Tenino was the destination of the Northern Pacific Railroad's 65-mile Pacific Division line between Kalama and Tenino as early as 1872. In 1874, a 40-mile line was built through Yelm to Commencement Bay in Tacoma; this line operated as a Burlington Northern line until the late 1980s. Tenino, known as the Stone City, built a sandstone depot, now the Tenino Depot Museum, in 1914 along the main line from Portland to Tacoma.
