Coshocton Three Rivers Bikeway

Ohio

The Coshocton Three Rivers Bikeway provides safe and direct access from the City of Coshocton to the Coshocton Lake Park



northwestern edge of downtown Coshocton.

The Coshocton Three Rivers Bikeway provides safe and direct access from the City of Coshocton to the Coshocton Lake Park Recreational Complex and historic Roscoe Village. Two crossings under US 36 eliminate the need to traverse several lanes of busy traffic.

In the north, the trail forms a loop around Middle Basin in the Lake Park Complex. From the park, a spur built on a short stretch of the former Ohio and Erie Canal towpath heads southwest to Roscoe Village, a restored 1830s canal town. The village features old-fashioned shops, restaurants, a museum and the launching point for horse-drawn canal boat rides on the Monticello III.

Another paved trail segment follows County Road 1A and Bridge Street from Coshocton Lake Park to the

Parking & Trail Access

Visitors to the area should park at the Coshocton Lake Park Recreational Complex to access the Coshocton Three Rivers Bikeway. From State Route 83, head north past downtown Coshocton. The route overlaps with US 36 for a short distance, so be sure to follow the signs for the left turn to stay on SR 83. The park entrance is to the left just north of there.

Restrooms and drinking fountains are available at the parking area.



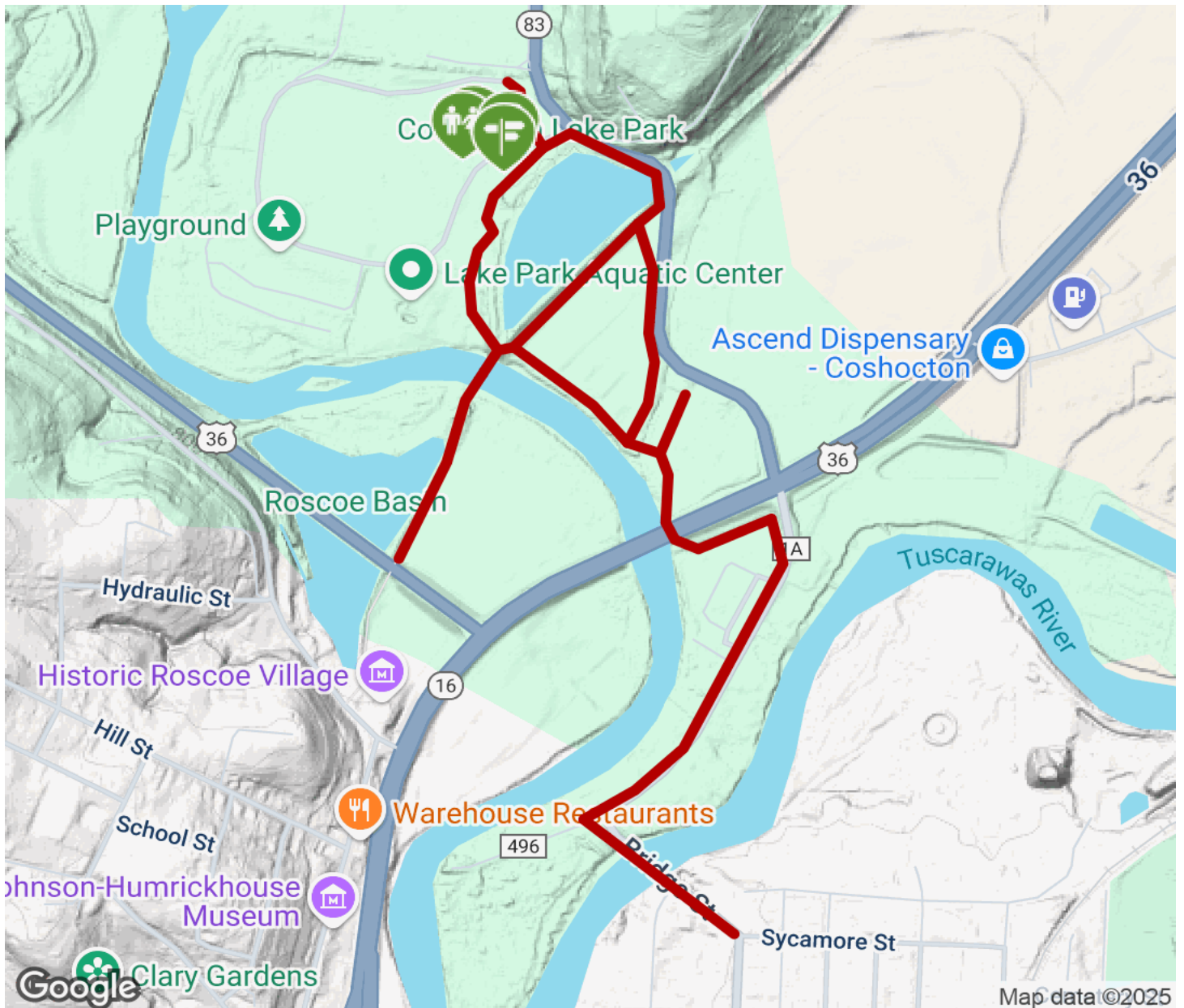
