Klara Sauer Trail

New York

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The Klara Sauer Trail (formerly known as the Beacon Riverside Trail) runs for 1 mile along the Hudson River on the west side of New York's village of Beacon. The trail occupies the same corridor as the live commuter rail, between the Beacon train station and Dennings Point.

The trail is natural surface and wheelchair accessible. Cyclists, walkers and anglers use the trail, which also offers nice bird-watching along the river.

Parking & Trail Access


The Klara Sauer Trail runs between Long Dock Park, 23 Long Dock Rd. (Beacon) and Denning's Point (Beacon).
