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Tatamy Trail begins in West Easton and heads north to Tatamy Borough, primarily along a former railroad corridor. On its southern end, it meets the [Palmer Township Recreation Trail](#), which connects the towns of Palmer and Bethlehem on nearly 8 miles of rail-trail.

The trail is paved and tree-lined with much of it following Bushkill Creek. Along the way, it passes through several parks (from south to north): Meuser, Hackett (where you'll find some steeper grades), Penn Pump, Penn's Grant Open Space, and Mill Race Park.

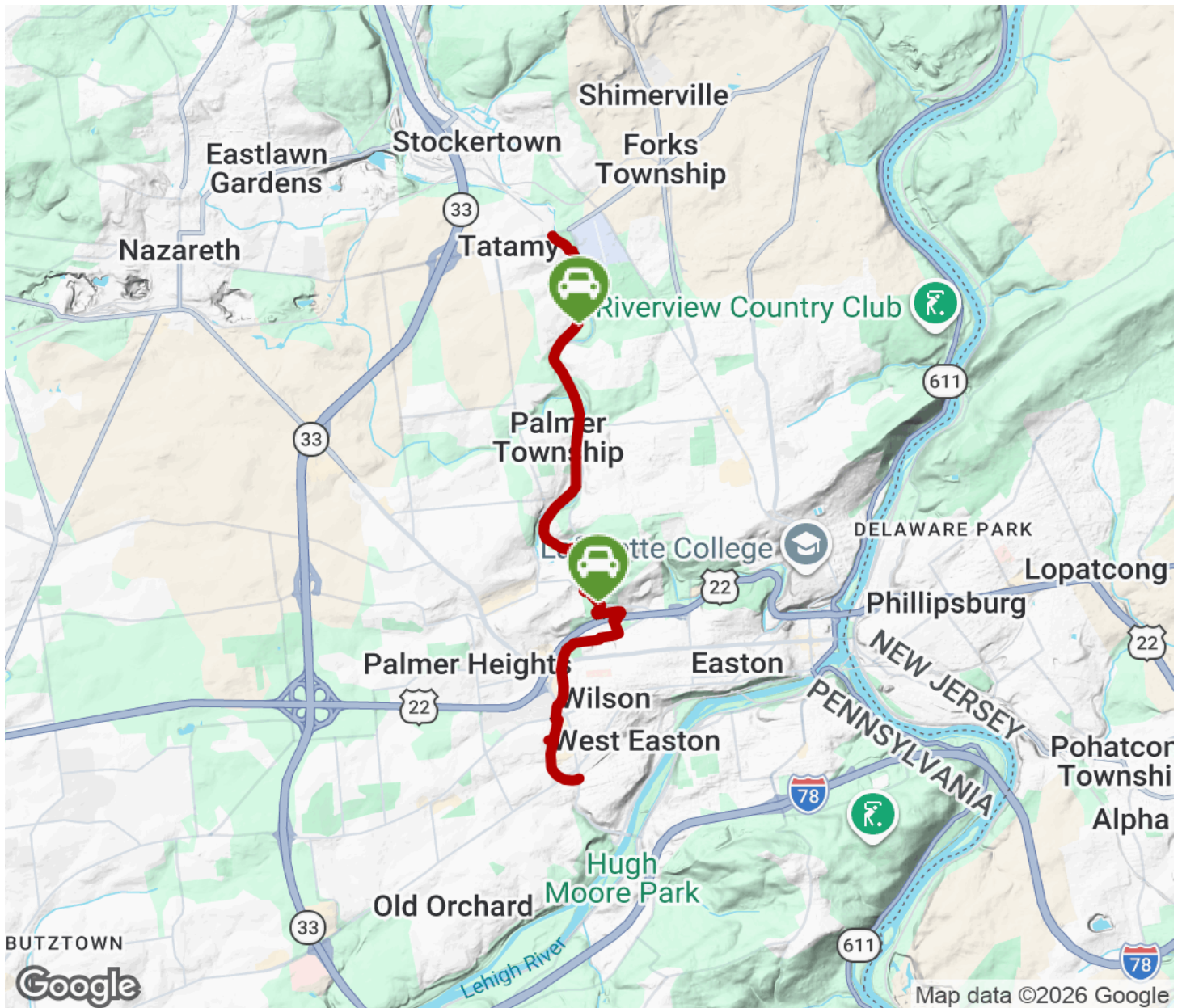
Parking & Trail Access
