Buffalo Valley Rail Trail

The Buffalo Valley Rail Trail, which runs between Lewisburg and Mifflinburg, is a 9.5-mile rail trail. About the Route The trail



awarded a matching grant for the acquisition of the 60-foot-wide abandoned corridor and an additional \$3.7 million in federal monies made available through the Federal Highway Transportation Enhancements Program. These grants, along with contributions from local citizens and Union County, have made the Buffalo Valley Trail a reality for all to appreciate.

About the Route

The trail features interpretive signs related to the region's history. The trail is mostly paved at both ends but the middle section has a gravel surface. Lewisburg is home to Bucknell University and supports a vibrant and quaint downtown area, with eateries, bike shops, and other boutique retail popular with trail users.

Parking is also available at:


