The Erie Trail (otherwise known as the North Judson Erie Trail) occupies the railbanked right-of-way of the former JK Line



The Erie Trail (otherwise known as the North Judson Erie Trail) occupies the railbanked right-of-way of the former JK Line Railroad, running over eleven miles from the east side of North Judson southeast to County Road 700 near Bass Lake. Eventually, the trail will extend another 5 miles to Monterey where it will link with that town's [Monterey Erie Trail](#). Equestrian use is allowed between County Rd. 100 W and County Rd. 700 E

The trail passes through a landscape of hardwood forest, sand prairies and wetlands, far enough away from major roads and developments that it allows for peaceful exploration. You may encounter wildlife along the trail, including turkeys, deer, waterfowl and other birds.

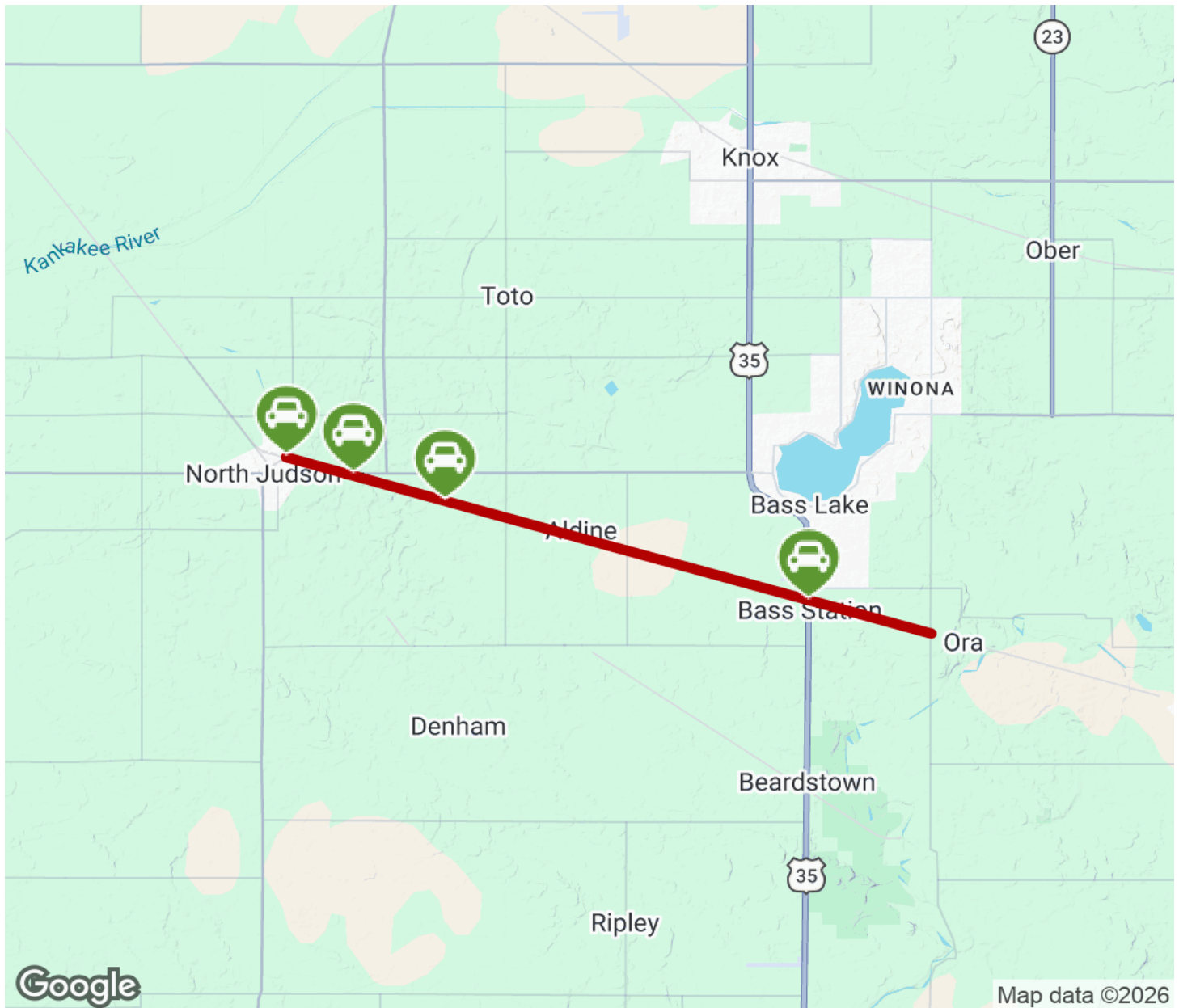
Parking & Trail Access
