Woodbridge Trail California



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The Woodbridge Trail, while short, is one of the most scenic in Irvine's extensive trail network. Views of two lakes and surrounding mountains unfold around each bend. It's a great route for families with kids, and that is what you will find. The curves and trail traffic enforce a slower pace, perfect for taking in the views on a sunny weekend.

Trail bridges offer safe passage over busy Alton Parkway and Barranca Parkway. The trail is well connected, intersecting both the <u>San Diego Creek Trail</u> and <u>Freeway Trail</u>. To the north, 0.7 mile of bike lanes on Yale Avenue take you to the <u>Walnut Trail</u>, which runs along an active rail line and offers yet another connection to the <u>Peters Canyon Trail</u>.
