Cleveland Foundation Centennial Lake Link Trail Ohio

In August 2014, a \$5 million grant from the Cleveland Foundation, a legacy gift in honor of its 100th anniversary, propelled the trail project forward. In recognition of this significant contribution, the trail, originally known as the Lake Link Trail, was renamed.

The first phase of the trail opened in the spring of 2015, stretching about a quarter-mile from Scranton Road to just south of Rivergate Park.

The second phase of the trail, which added just over a quarter-mile to the route, opened in 2017 just in time for another centennial anniversary: that of Cleveland Metroparks, the trail's steward organization. Running underneath the Detroit-Superior Bridge, it connects Detroit Avenue with River Road near the Willow Street Bridge. This section of the trail includes a massive pedestrian bridge over multiple active railroad tracks and features a contemporary, eye-catching design.

The third phase of the trail, a 500-foot pedestrian bridge over the Old River, opened in June 2021. Establishing increased lakefront access for both residents and visitors, the Wendy Park Bridge connects the trail with the Whiskey Island Trail and Wendy Park located on the banks of Lake Erie.

In addition to Lake Erie, the trail provides access to another of the city's famed waterways: the Cuyahoga River. Together, the lake and river positioned Cleveland historically as a shipping powerhouse. The trail itself is being built along the former Cleveland and Mahoning Railroad, which dates back to the 1850s.

On its other (southern) end, the trail provides a much-desired connection to the popular <u>Ohio and Erie Canalway Towpath</u> <u>Trail</u>, which unfolds southward from Cleveland more than 90 miles through a scenic National Heritage Corridor.

As part of Cleveland's trail network, it also connects to a number of other trails. Briefly follow the <u>Cleveland Lakefront</u> <u>Bikeway</u> to bridge the temporary gap between the two segments of the Cleveland Foundation Centennial Lake Link Trail. The trail's southern segment also meets the <u>Red Line</u> <u>Greenway (Metroparks Trail)</u> at the triple intersection of Riverbed St, Carter Rd, and Columbus Rd. Other trails in the area are the <u>Lake-to-Lakes Trail</u> and the <u>Opportunity Corridor</u> <u>Trail</u>.
