California

Irvine's Jeffrey Open Space Trail, currently open in three disconnected segments, has won awards for its landscaping and



again and heads south to I-405. Along the way, connections to the San Diego Creek Trail and the Freeway Trail increase the trail's utility. Near the trail's southern end, cross over the freeway on a pedestrian bridge and link with the Juanita Moe Trail heading east or the popular University Trail heading west.

Connections

At Bryan Ave., the trail connects to the [Vents Spur Trail](#).

Near Hoeptner Park, the trail connects to the [Walnut Trail](#).

At San Diego Creek, the trail connects to the [San Deigo Creek Trail](#).

At the southern end of the trail, the trail connects to the [Juanita Moe Trail](#) and the [University Trail](#).

Irvine's Jeffrey Open Space Trail, currently open in three disconnected segments, has won awards for its landscaping and innovative design incorporating a series of intaglio panels in the concrete bed of the trail. The panels take you through a 500-year history of the Irvine Ranch area.

About the Route

The paved trail parallels Jeffrey Road among a suburban landscape of neighborhoods, shopping plazas, and, as the name suggests, open space. There's a break in the trail between Interstate 5 and the next short segment, which intersects the Walnut Trail adjacent to an active rail line.

At Barranca Parkway, the third and final segment picks up

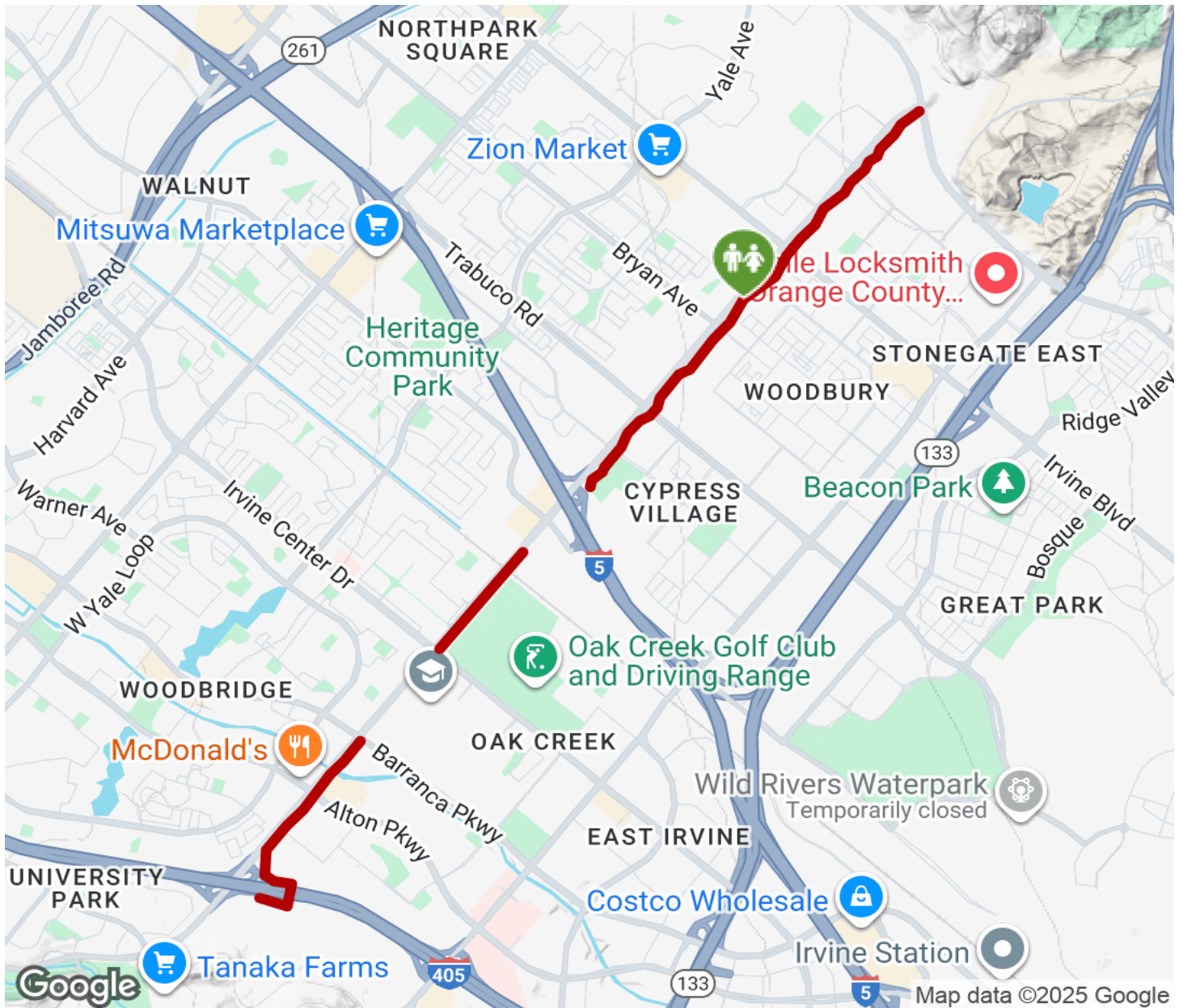
