Root River Pathway (Route of the Badger)

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The Root River Pathway uses a combination of off-road trail and on-road route to form a crescent around the City of Racine. The trail closely follows the bends of the Root River, making it a great place to appreciate the waterway's natural beauty. Signposts along the way educate trail users about the river's significant role in the development of modern-day Racine.

The trail also links together a number of city parks, including Cedar Bend, Horlick, Lincoln, Colonial, Brose, Island and Belle City. At Layard Avenue, connect to the [MRK Trail](#) to travel north along an active rail line to the Village of Caledonia. At the Main Street bridge in downtown Racine, take the [Lake Michigan Pathway](#) to follow the city's scenic lakeshore.

Parking for the Root River Pathway can be found at most of the city parks along the trail's route.



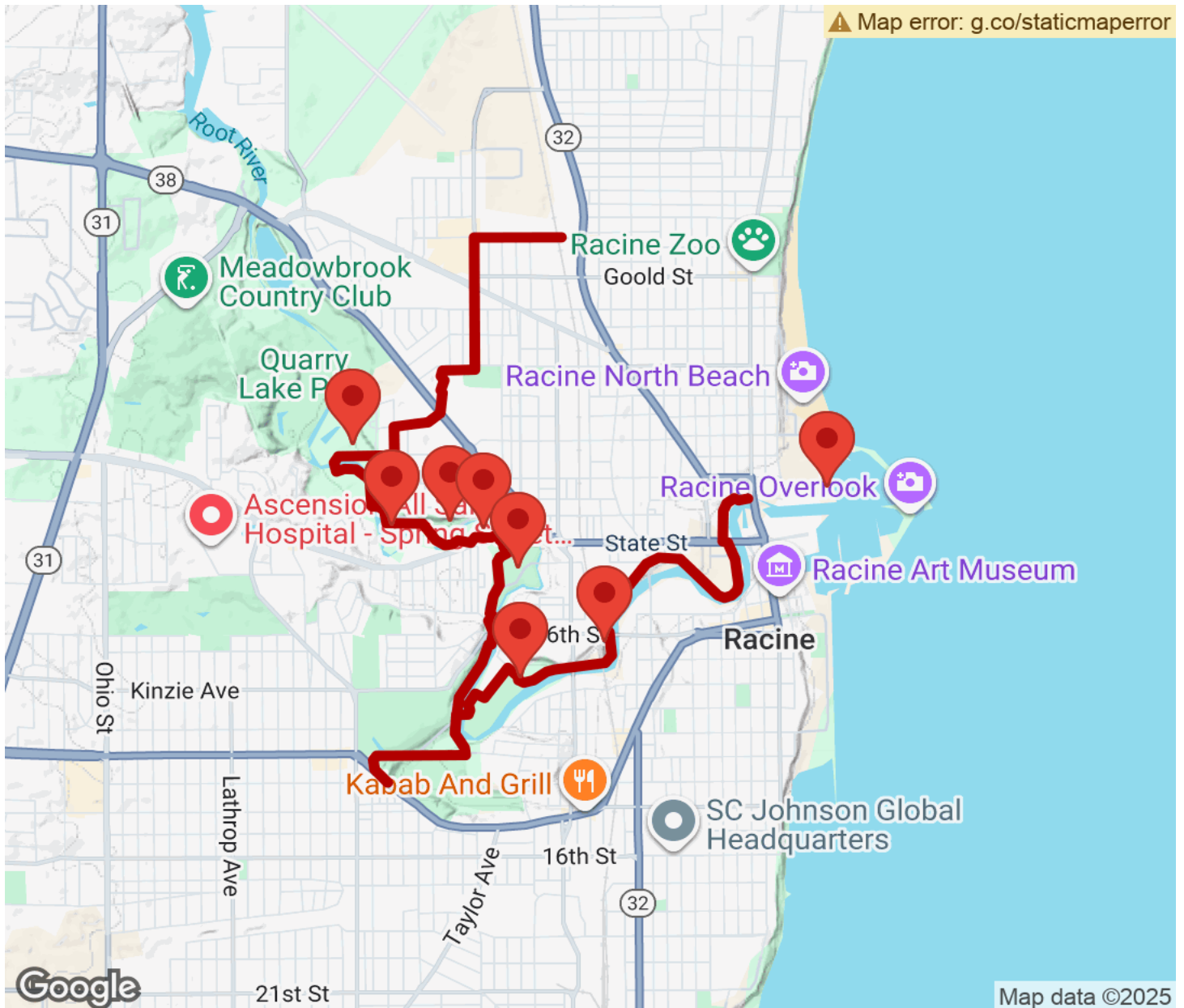
