Gig Harbor's 6.2-mile Cushman Trail is a paved, non-motorized route for pedestrian and bike use. The trail shares much of its



mile west of Puget Sound.

Gig Harbor's 6.2-mile Cushman Trail is a paved, non-motorized route for pedestrian and bike use. The trail shares much of its corridor with overhead Tacoma Power electric lines. Along the way, trail users will traverse several large hills through areas of scenic beauty. A short but hilly trail, this provides a scenic and challenging route for bikers and pedestrians alike.

About the Route

In the north, the trail winds through Wilkinson Farm Park on a pin pile bridge to minimize the impact on the natural wetlands. An on-road segment near the trail's midpoint connects bikers and pedestrians to Gig Harbor's Pierce Transit Park and Ride lot on Kimball Drive. In the south, the trail parallels State Route 16 before ending less than a

The Cushman Trail runs between 3150 14th Ave NW (Gig Harbor) and Borgen Blvd. (Gig Harbor), with parking available on both ends.

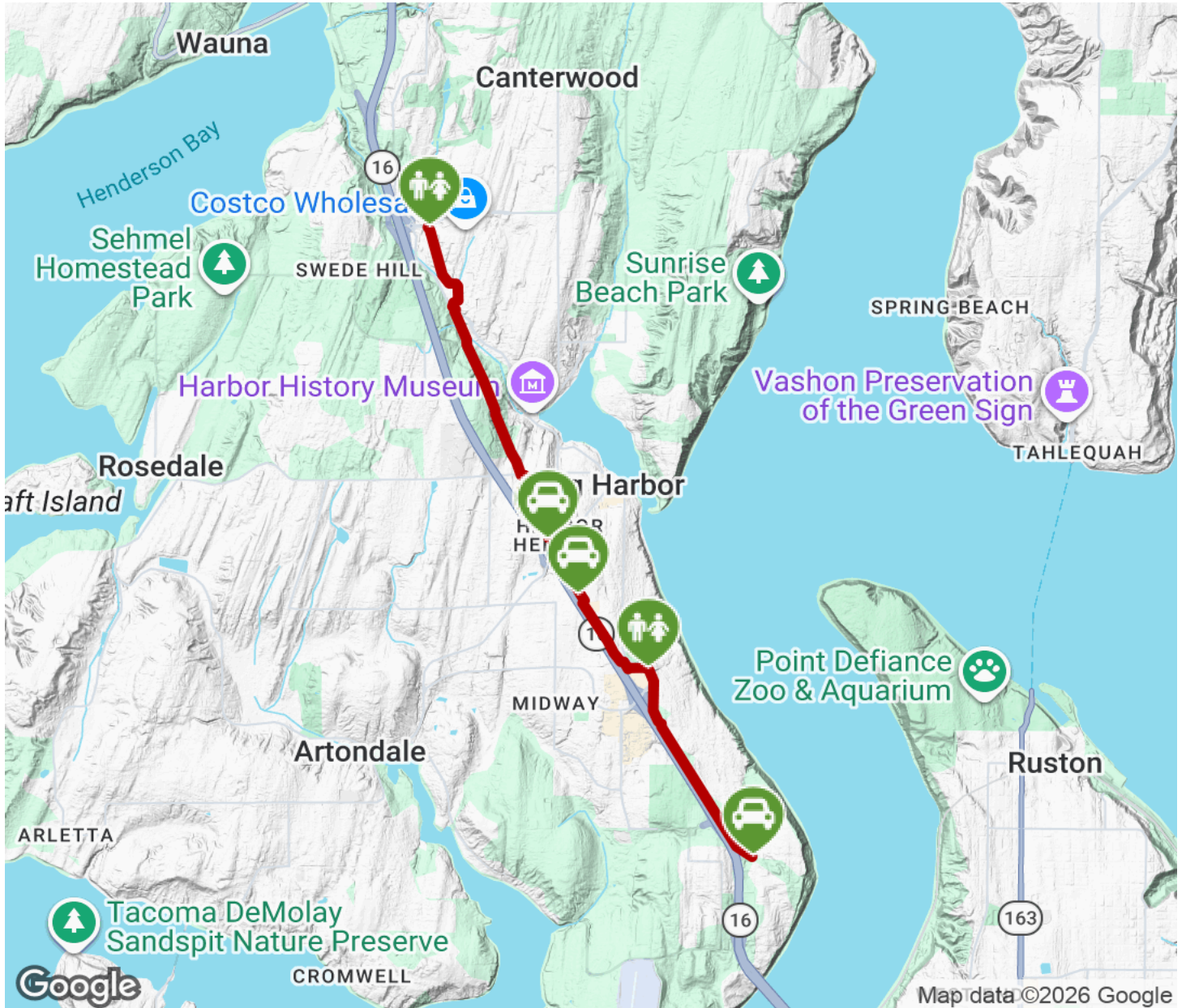
