there, the trail heads north and then east along the river through Carrier Park, where trail users can find many athletic facilities, a playground, picnic pavilion, river overlooks, boat landing and a wetland interpretive and education area.

The continues along Amboy Road to French Broad River Park, which offers lots of open green space, a wildflower garden, a dog park, picnic areas, an observation deck and a playground. The trail continues north from the park to trail's end at Craven Street, just south of I-240.

The French Broad River Greenway links three of Asheville's parks: Hominy Creek River Park, Carrier Park, and French Broad River Park. The trail follows the river, coursing through a wooded strip of land, through the parks and among some residential and light commercial sites.
