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Grand Canal Path *Arizona*



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The 34.8-mile Grand Canal Path is one of the longest multi-use trails in the Phoenix metropolitan area, linking the large cities of Glendale, Phoenix, and Tempe. Like many of the area's trails, the Grand Canal Path follows an irrigation canal: in this case, the Grand Canal, which was built in 1878 and is the oldest remaining area canal north of the Salt River.

About the Route

For most of its route, the trail offers paved and gravel options on opposite sides of the canal, with the rougher surface generally preferred by equestrian users and joggers. Notable sites along the route include State Farm Stadium, Glendale Heroes Regional Park, and the Phoenix Zoo, just a short distance from the trail's eastern end.



Connections

The Grand Canal Path connects to the <u>New River Trail</u> at its western end.
