Tempe Canal Path

Arizona



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The Tempe Canal Path parallels the Tempe Canal between the cities of Tempe and Mesa. The trail consists of two disconnected segments, separated by the private Mesa Country Club. Both segments serve a large number of residents, businesses and public facilities. The trail is entirely paved, with a gravel alternative for equestrian users and joggers available on the opposite side of the canal.

From the trail's eastern end in Mesa, trail users can continue southeast on the [Consolidated Canal Path](#) to reach Gilbert and Chandler, or head north on the [Southern Canal Path](#) to enter the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community.

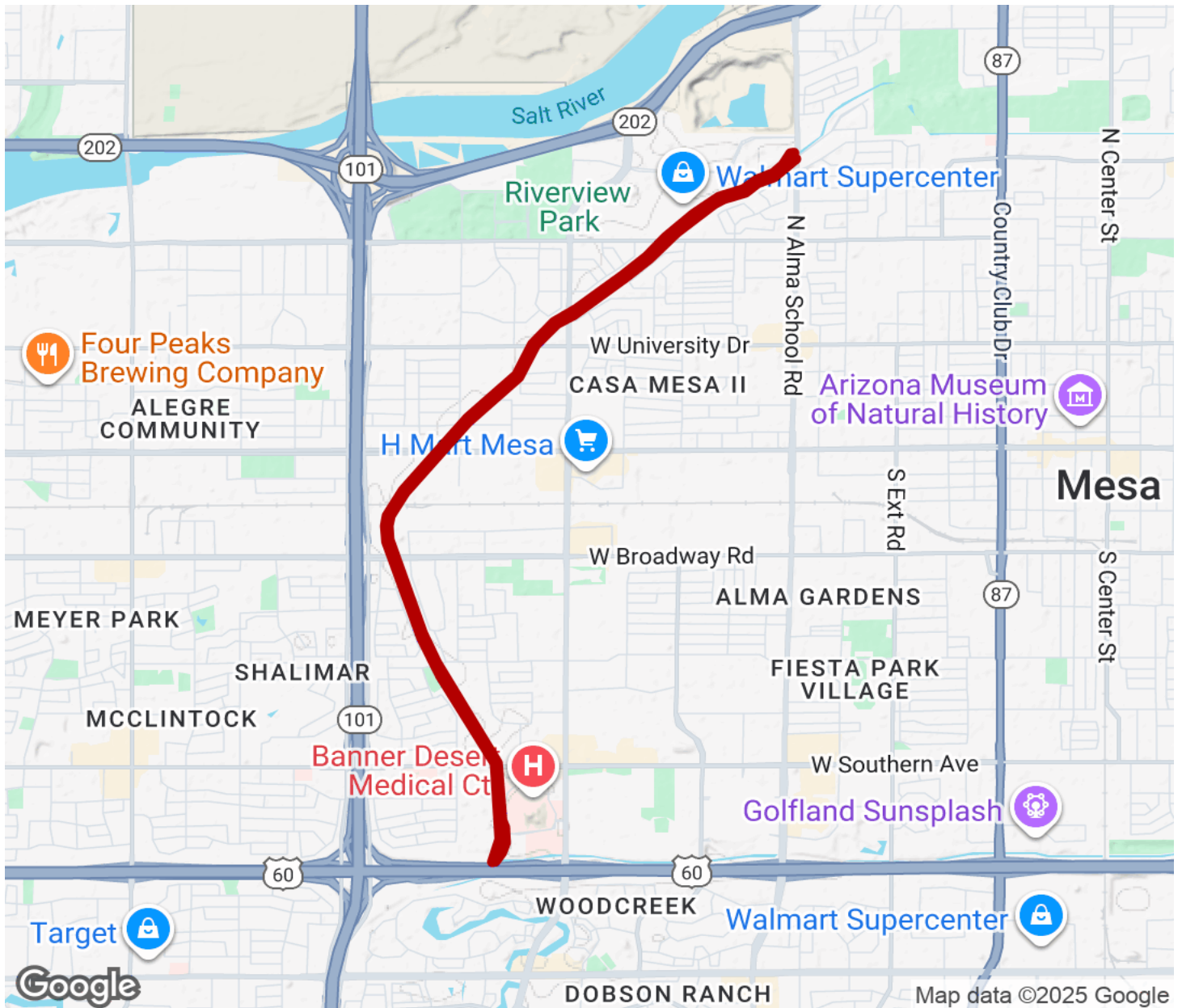
Parking & Trail Access
