About the Route

The trail extends between Sierra College Boulevard and Darling Way, with a break in the trail between Folsom Road and Royer Park. The gap is easily bridged on-road by following Linda Drive, Lincoln Street, Park Drive, and Deitrich Drive. The trail provides easy access between downtown Roseville and Miners Ravine Preserve.

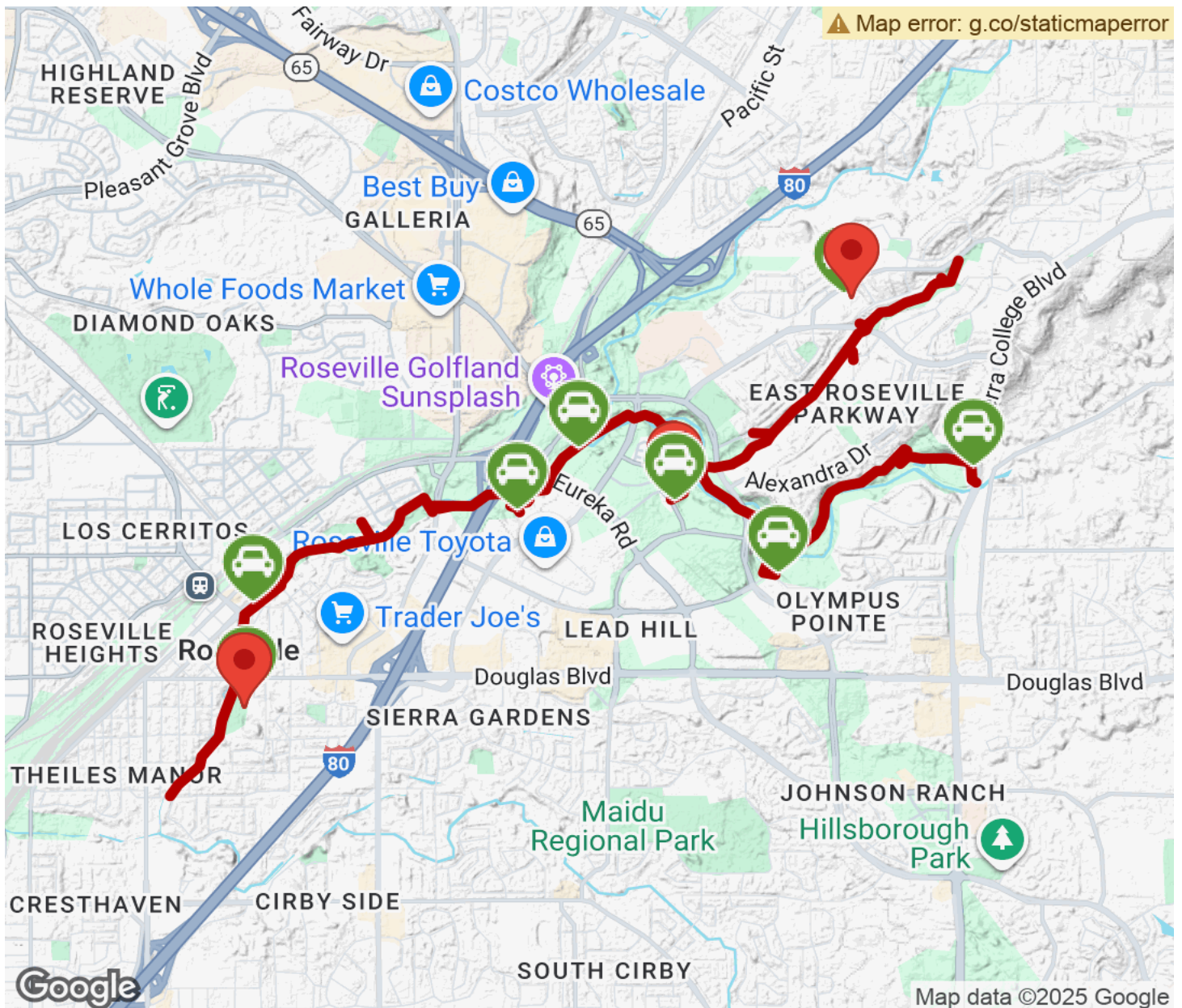
