Virginia Central Railway Trail

Virginia

Situated midway between the nation's capital and the Virginia capital of Richmond, the Virginia Central Railway Trail currently



The railroad for which the trail was named began in 1857, but wasn't completed until 1877 due to the Civil War. The future trail will follow the former rail line, connecting three major Civil War battlefield sites in Fredericksburg, Chancellorsville, and Wilderness. Each is a National Park service site with its own network of trails.

Situated midway between the nation's capital and the Virginia capital of Richmond, the Virginia Central Railway Trail currently spans 4.5 miles throughout Fredericksburg.

About the Route

The trail offers more than 4 miles of trail across two disconnected segments: one from downtown Fredericksburg to the Idlewild neighborhood and the other in nearby Chancellor. While the western segment is far more rural, the eastern segment runs through a more densely populated area of Fredericksburg.

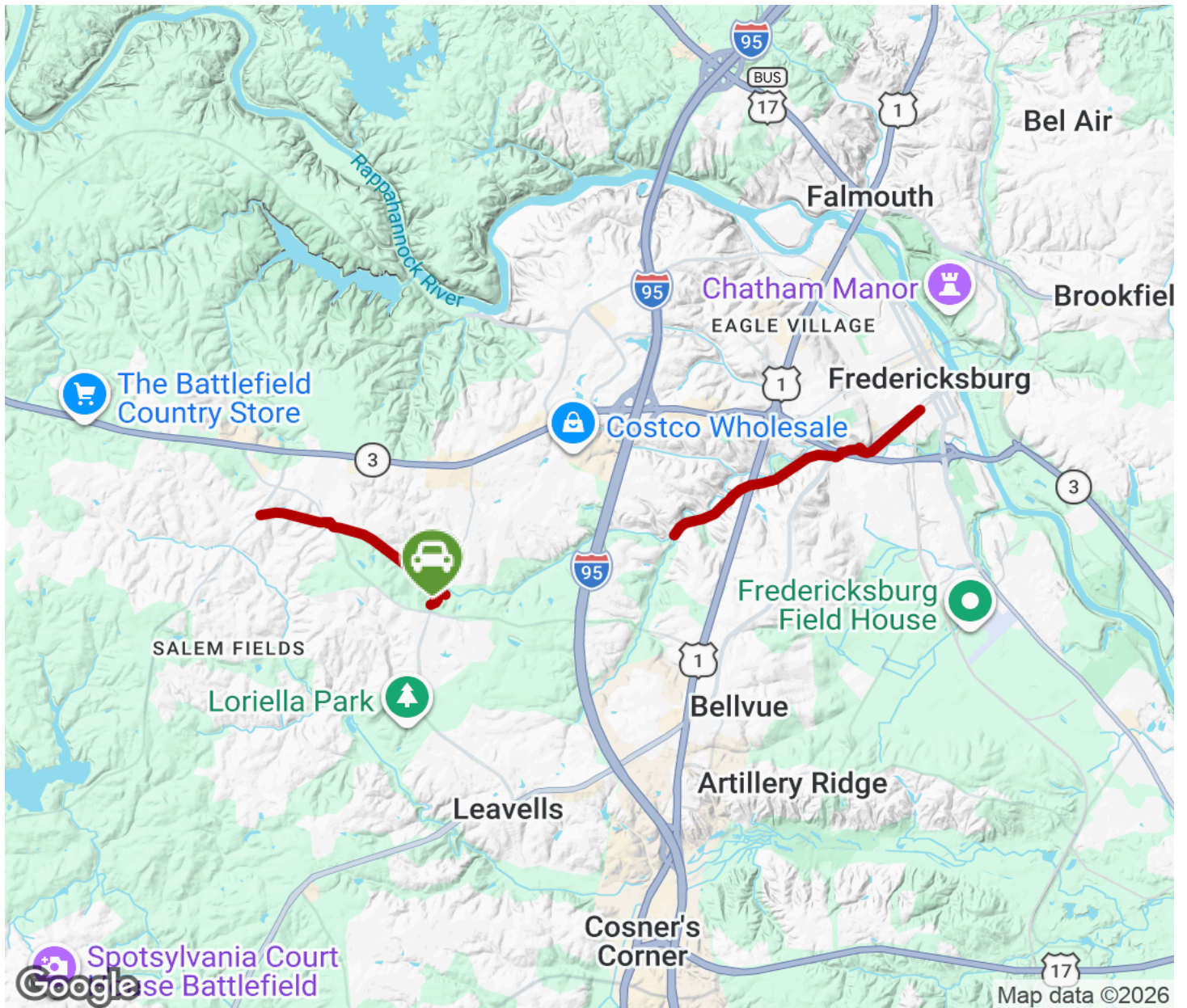
