*Closure Notice: Due to Construction on US-85, the C-470 Bikeway will be rerouted around the McLellen Reservoir via. the High Line*



The trail circles the city of Denver from the western foothills and the southern suburban communities.

### Connections

The paved trail connects to many other regional and local trails, including the [High Line Canal Trail](#), [Mary Carter Greenway \(Arapahoe Greenway\)](#), [Bear Creek Trail](#), and [Cherry Creek Regional Trail](#).

Closure Notice: Due to Construction on US-85, the C-470 Bikeway will be rerouted around the McLellen Reservoir via. the High Line Canal Trail (CO) and the Mary Carter Greenway.

The C-470 Bikeway—also known as the C-470 Trail and Centennial Trail in Douglas County—provides open views of the Colorado foothills as it follows the southwestern segment of Denver's beltway. Along the way, the trail provides access to many desirable destinations such as Chatfield Lake, Green Mountain, and Bear Creek Lake Park, as well as massive retail centers in Centennial.

There is parking at several points along the trail, including at Bear Creek Lake Park in Lakewood and Chatfield State Park in Littleton. See TrailLink Map for more information.




