*The Tramway Recreation Trail follows Tramway Boulevard, a major north-south route on the eastern edge of Albuquerque. The*



The Tramway Recreation Trail follows Tramway Boulevard, a major north-south route on the eastern edge of Albuquerque. The path runs along the foothills that skirt the city, offering spectacular views of the Sandia Mountains and the Rio Grande Valley. As the route does cross some busy roads, trail-goers should use caution through the pedestrian crossings.

Near the southern end of the trail, travelers can pick up the [I-40 Trail](#) at the corner of Tramway Boulevard and US Route 66 to reach Los Altos Park, a popular recreational destination. The Tramway Recreation Trail also connects to the [Embudo Recreation Trail](#), which heads west for 1.6 miles.

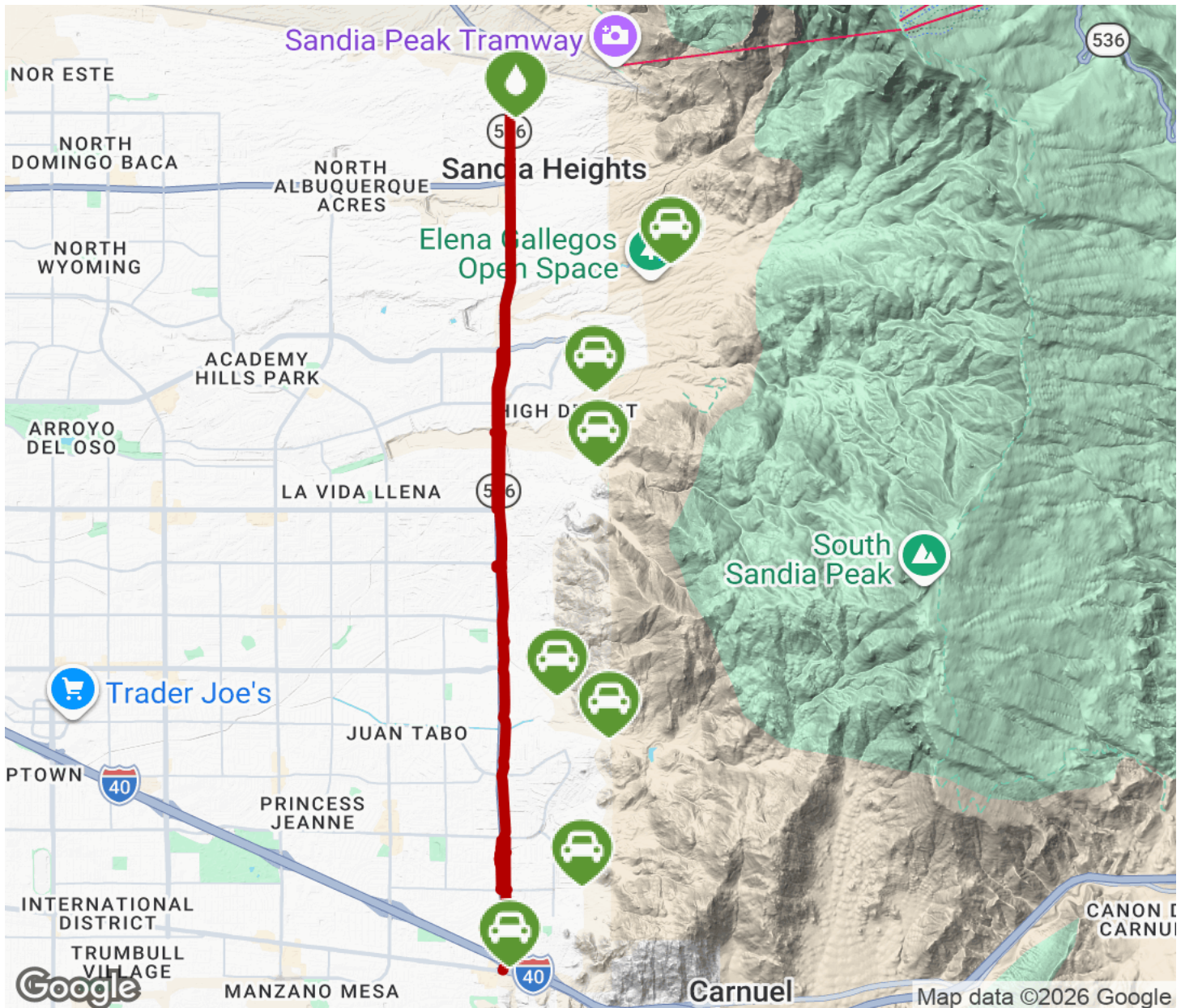
