The Green-to-Cedar Rivers Trail passes through Lake Wilderness Park on its way through the Maple Valley to SE 276th Street. The southern end of the trail is a dead-end near Ravensdale Creek.

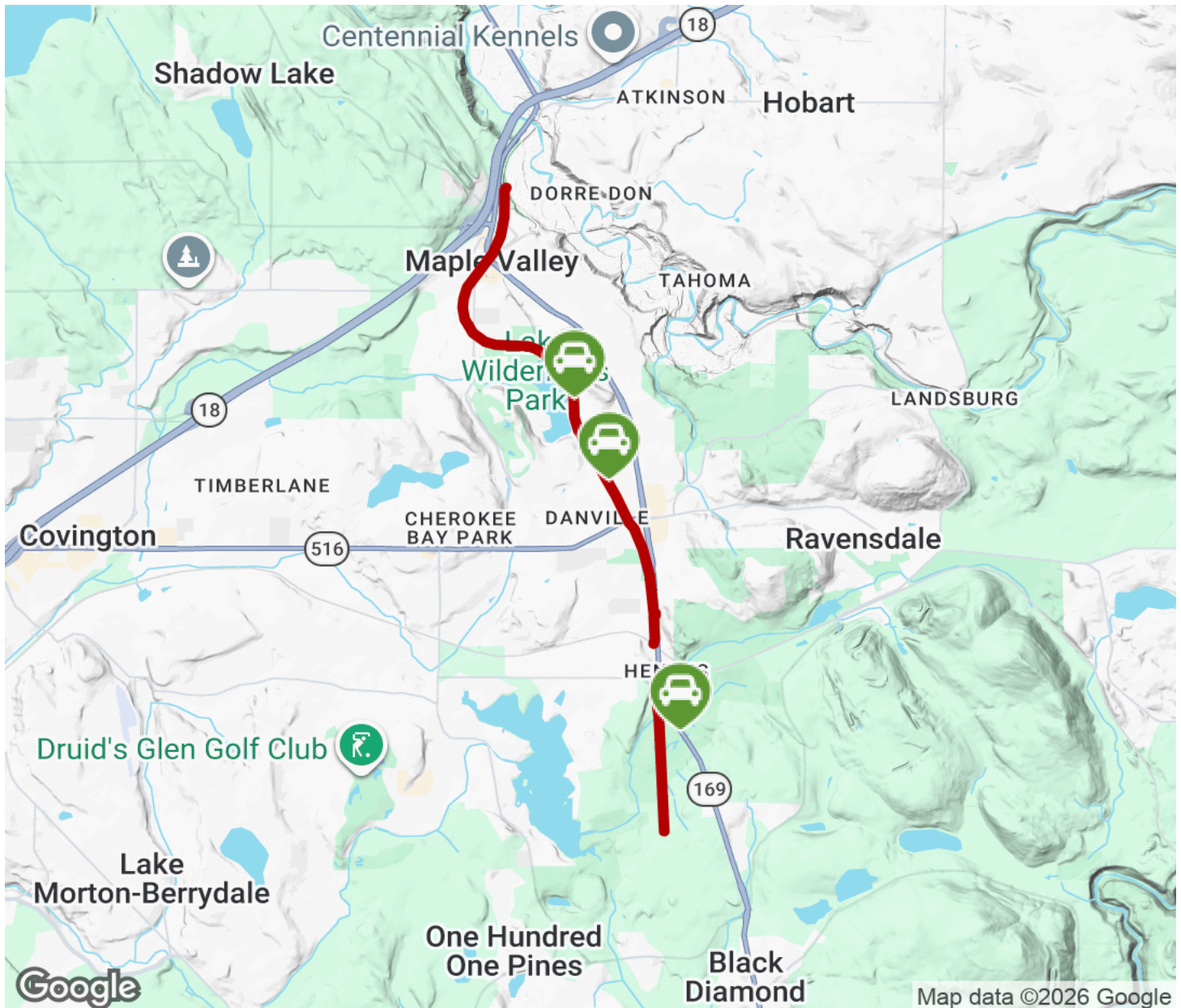
Parking for the Green-to-Cedar Rivers Trail has parking at the Black Diamond Natural Area Parking Lot (not an exact address).
