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The Poison Creek Trail travels along the east side of City Park and into a historical area of Park City, originally a mining town. On this urban pathway, trail-goers will pass an eclectic mix of athletic fields, sculptures, murals in one of several short tunnels, residences and historical sites. The route also provides access to many shops and restaurants, and connects to the 28-mile [Historic Union Pacific Rail Trail State Park](#) at its northern end.

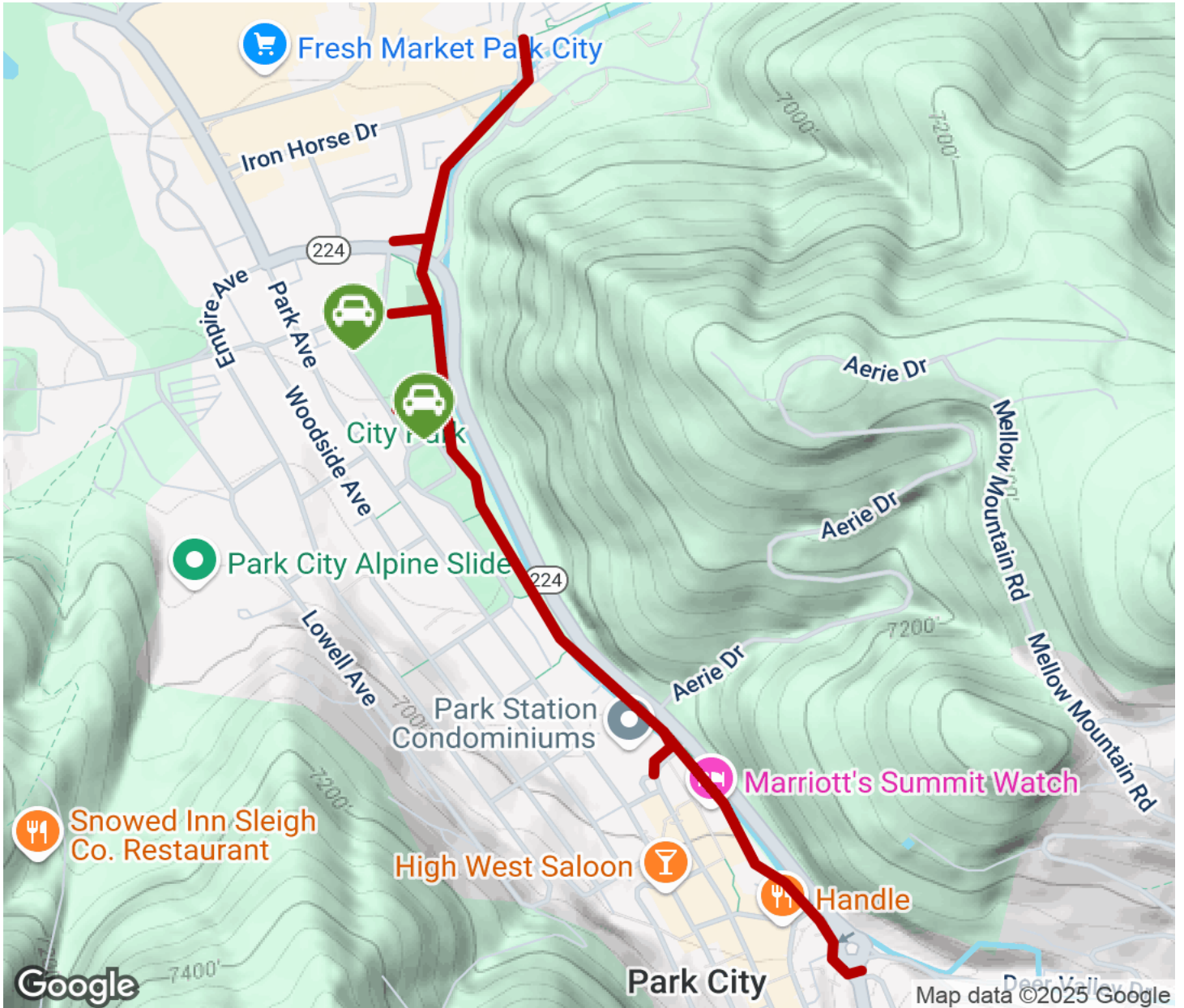
Parking & Trail Access
