North Hills Harmony Trail

Pennsylvania

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The Harmony Trail in the North Hills is managed by volunteers with the Rachel Carson Trails Conservancy. The 0.8-mile route is essentially an out-and-back route with the best access from Wexford-Bayne Road.

The rail line was originally an interurban trolley line that ran between Pittsburgh, Evans City, Butler, and New Castle from 1908 to 1931. Today, the old track follows a wooded corridor parallel to Route 19.

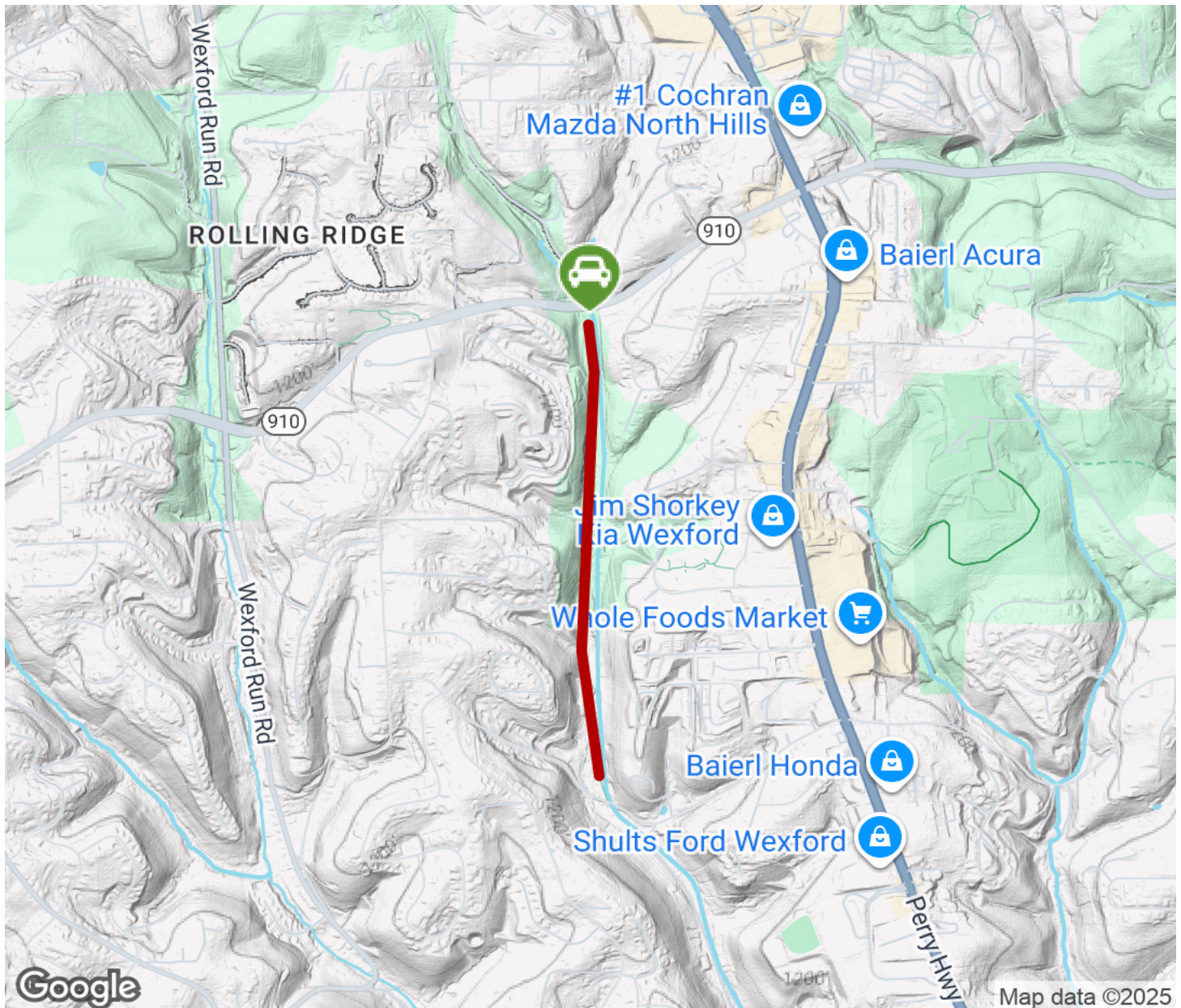
