South Manchester Rail Trail

New Hampshire

The South Manchester Rail Trail is a developing bike/pedestrian path that currently runs through the City of Manchester's southeast



This section of the South Manchester Rail Trail is referred to as the Nutts Pond Segment and is generally residential/wooded in nature. There are plans to extend the trail north from South Beech Street to Manchester's [Heritage Trail and Riverwalk](#), but this section has not yet been designed. This connection would provide a link to the [Piscataquog Trail](#), which crosses the river and stretches northeast to the [Goffstown Rail Trail](#).

The South Manchester Rail Trail serves the surrounding communities as a safe, accessible link to businesses, parks, ponds, brooks, and other amenities.

The South Manchester Rail Trail is a developing bike/pedestrian path that currently runs through the City of Manchester's southeast neighborhoods to the border with the Town of Londonderry. The rail-trail utilizes the Right-of-Way (ROW) of the abandoned Boston and Maine Railroad.

The trail stretches 1.8 miles between Queen City Ave. and Perimeter Road. The South Manchester Rail Trail is paved and 10 feet wide. Heading south from Queen City Ave., the rail-trail links to Precourt Park/Nutts Pond recreational area and provides access points from the local neighborhood side streets. The southern end is on Perimeter Road at the Manchester-Boston Regional Airport. On the other side of the airport, the [Londonderry Rail Trail](#) meanders 4.5 miles south.

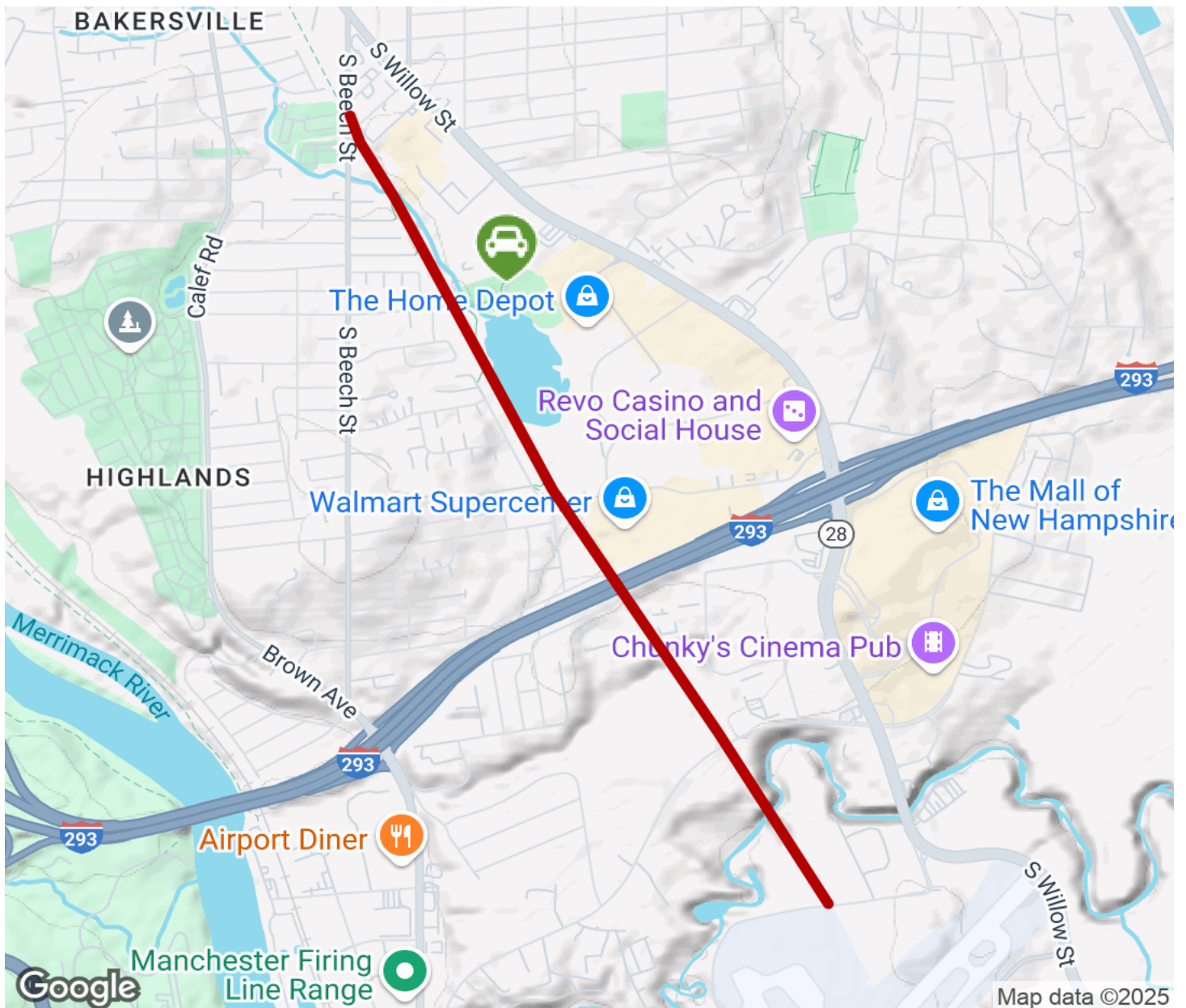
