Watsonville Slough Trail

California

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The Watsonville Slough Trail follows its namesake waterway through a residential area of the city. It's part of a system of trails in a wetland area abundant with birds; you might see ducks, cormorants, pelicans, herons, egrets, hawks or many others. The trail ends at the entrance to Ramsay Park, which offers a nature center, restrooms, picnic areas, playgrounds and athletic facilities.

West of the trail, you'll find the [Upper Struve Slough Trail](#) and the [Ohlone Loop Trail](#), which you can use to explore the neighboring Struve Slough.

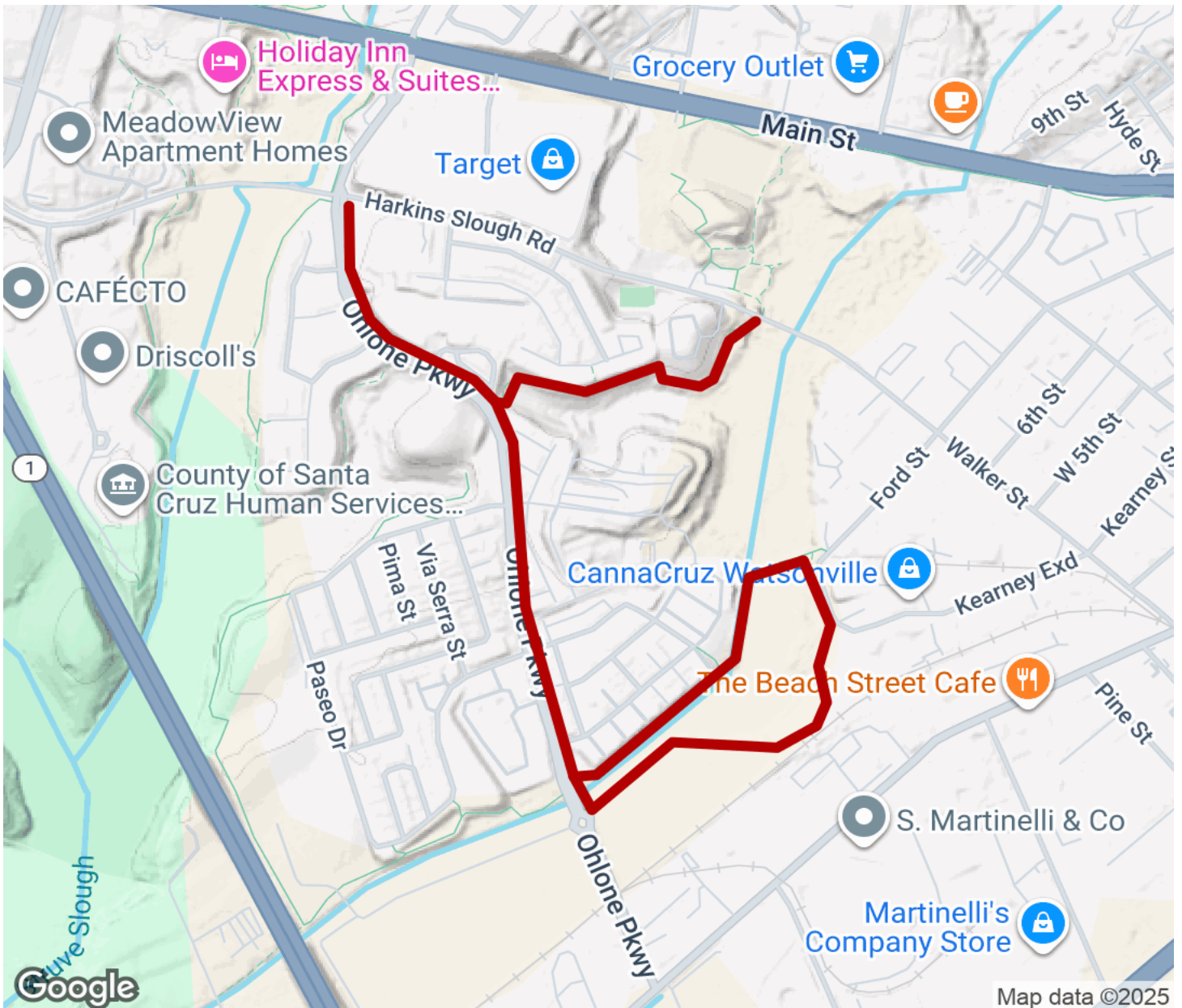
Parking & Trail Access
