

At West College Ave., the Fox River Trail connects to the eastern end of the <u>Glacial Drumlin State Trail</u>, which heads west towards Madison for more than 50 miles.

The Fox River Trail runs diagonally along its namesake waterway through Waukesha in southeastern Wisconsin (just outside of Milwaukee).

About the Route

At the trail's northern end is Frame Park, where there is a baseball diamond, boat ramp, picnic shelter, garden and playgrounds. Fox River Park lies at the trail's southern end. The 257-acre park is a beauty with wetlands, forests and wildflowers. A Nature Play Area offers rock climbing and two large slides, including one that's 32 feet. Picnic areas, observation decks and fishing access round out the park's many recreational amenities.
