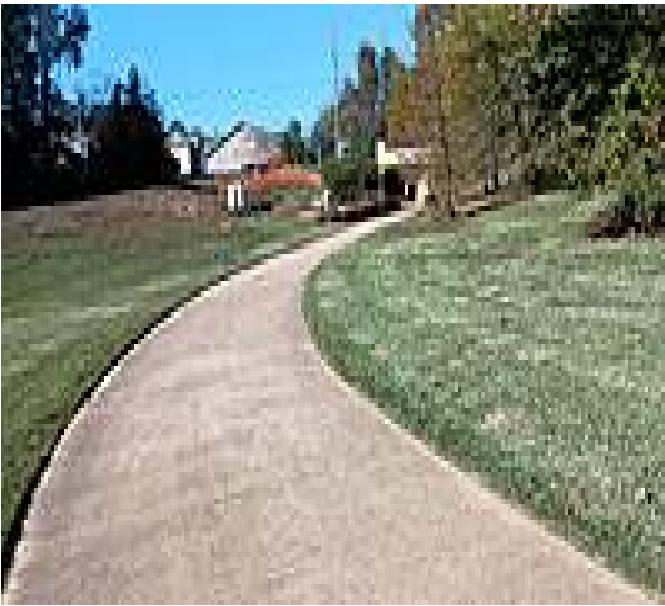

## Paul G. Boorman Trail

*As one of the three multi-use trails in Longview, Texas, the Paul G. Boorman Trail (named after a long-time city employee) runs for*



As one of the three multi-use trails in Longview, Texas, the Paul G. Boorman Trail (named after a long-time city employee) runs for three miles along Grace Creek. Along its route it passes the Paul G. Boorman Trail Park and Louis Jackson Park, which features a playgrounds.

Trail users can combine the Paul G. Boorman Trail, [Guthrie Trail](#), and the [Cargill Long Park Trail](#) for an over 10-mile one trip that zigzags through the city of Longview. The Guthrie Trail leaves off from the Paul G. Boorman Trail's southern endpoint.

At the Trail's northern endpoint, there is parking at 121 Summers Dr. At the southern endpoint, there is parking at 919 W Marshall Ave.

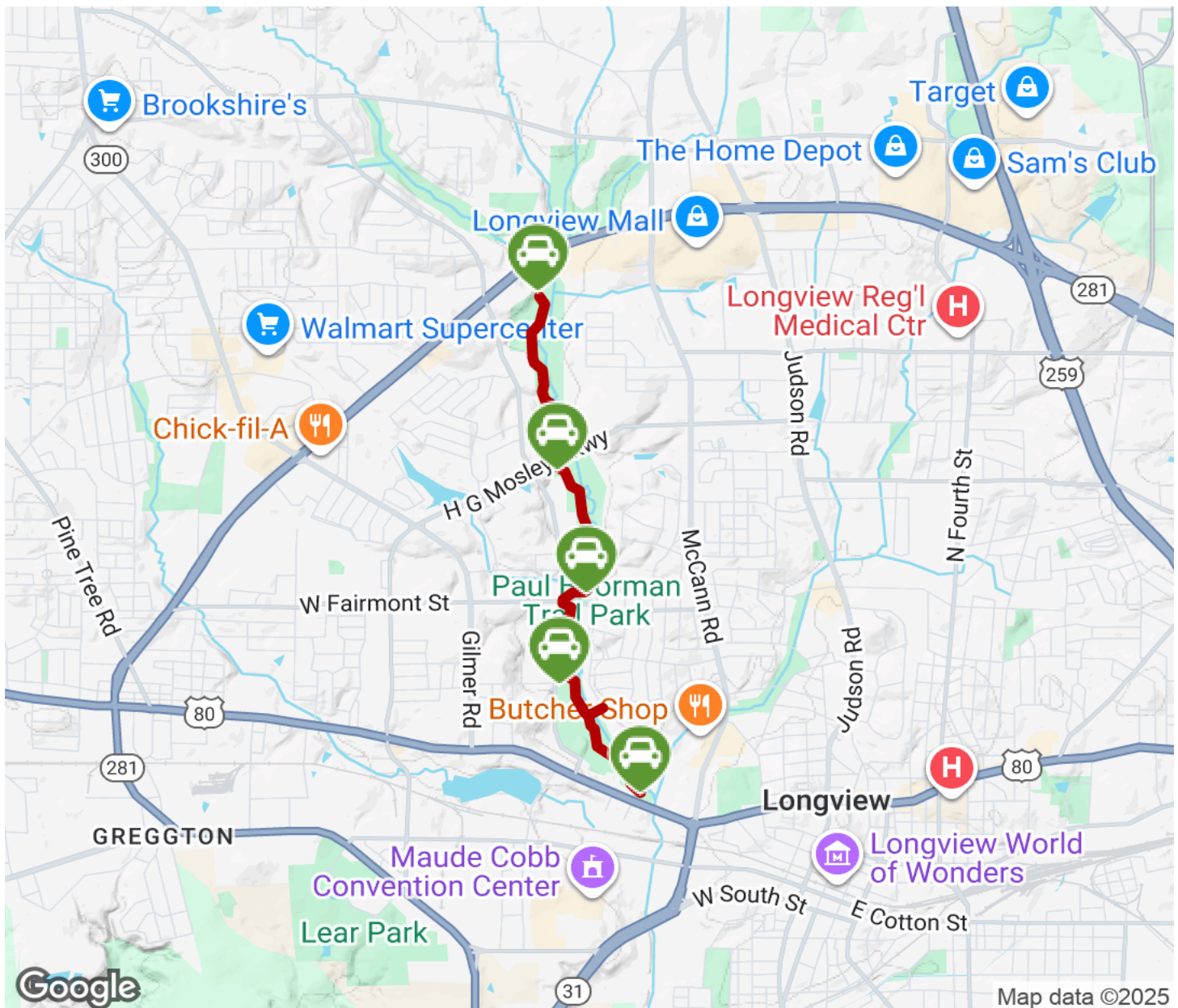
