The Chelatchie Prairie Railroad Trail—also known as the Chelatchie Prairie Rail-with-Trail—is currently open from Battle



The Chelatchie Prairie Railroad Trail—also known as the Chelatchie Prairie [Rail-with-Trail](#)—is currently open from Battle Ground Lake State Park to a point nearly 1 mile southwest. The paved trail runs next to the Clark County-owned Chelatchie Prairie Railroad, which sees limited freight and excursion rail use.

Clark County is planning on extending the trail along the entire 33-mile length of the railroad from the existing [Burnt Bridge Creek Trail](#) near Hazel Dell Avenue in Vancouver to the railroad's northern terminus in Chelatchie Prairie.

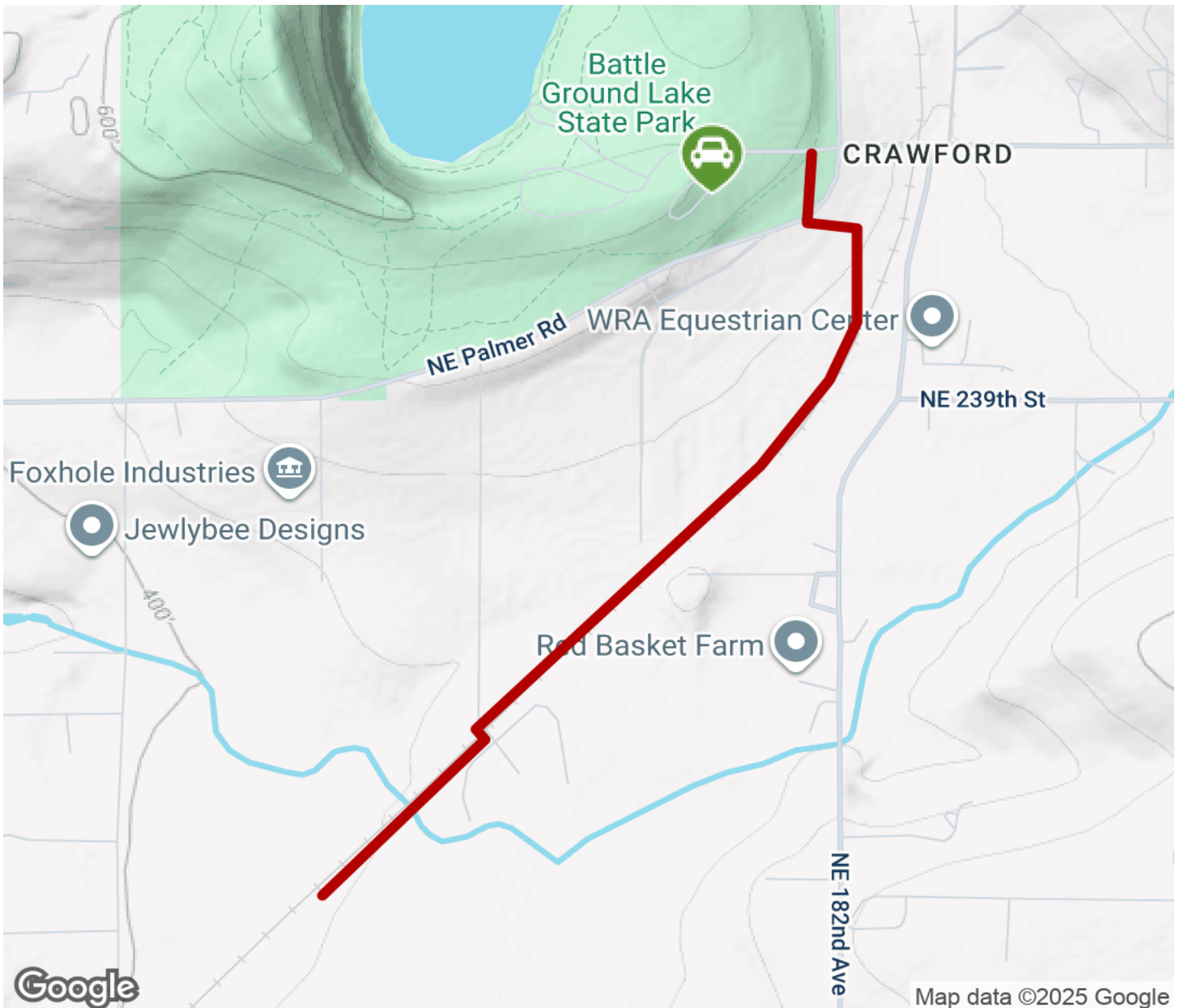
Parking & Trail Access
