Although short, this paved half-mile trail provides connections to three parks, as well as a unique attraction in northern

Although short, this paved half-mile trail provides connections to three parks, as well as a unique attraction in northern Independence. On the northern end of the trail sits Mill Creek Park, which has sports facilities, playgrounds, and picnic areas to enjoy.

From there, the tree-lined route heads south to Slover Memorial Park. Cross the park traveling northeast and the trail reaches the Harry S. Truman Library and Museum, where you can see photographs, film clips, and artifacts about the president's life. The library even offers a Oval Office replica.

From the park, continue south on the sidewalk paralleling North Delaware Street, which heads under US Highway 24. Shortly, the trail arrives at McCoy Park, named after


Parking & Trail Access
